FEMALE CHAPERONE GUIDE

2. GENERAL:

a. Chaperones act as resident mentors and role models for the female cadets participating in JCLC, while assisting in maintaining their health, welfare, and safety. Chaperones are another support system to help the cadets enjoy and benefit from the JCLC experience. They must be at least 21 years of age, recommended by their SAI, and approved by the JCLC Commandant. They must be physically able to carry out their assigned duties.

b. A minimum of five chaperones are required to safely conduct JCLC. At least one chaperone will be assigned to each training platoon for the duration of JCLC, and the fifth will provide overall coordination and liaison for the chaperones with the Training Company personnel, JCLC Commandant, and the JCLC staff. She will substitute for platoon chaperones in their absence.

3. SPECIFIC RULES/GUIDELINES FOR CHAPERONES:

a. Chaperones will control and supervise the activities of female cadets during administrative and off-duty time when they are not under the direct control of the training company personnel.

b. Chaperones will attend each training event with their platoon. The chaperones are encouraged to observe training and to participate where practical.

c. Chaperones must reside in the designated female living area at JCLC. They will be billeted so as to provide continuous supervision to the female cadets. The chaperones are expected to be available 24 hours a day. Exceptions must be approved by the JCLC Commandant.

- d.** Chaperones are expected to consume all meals with the cadets in their assigned platoon.
- e.** Chaperones will escort female cadets to medical facilities as needed IAW the Camp Rudder JCLC Medical Support Plan.
- f.** Chaperones are expected to conduct themselves to the same standards as JROTC instructors while in the presence of cadets.
- g.** Chaperones should wear conservative, comfortable, and practical clothing and footwear. ACUs may be worn if issued by their host school program. Chaperones will be issued a distinctive color hat to wear at JCLC to identify their position as chaperones.
- h.** Chaperones should know and quiz the cadets on the daily safety slogan, and check cadets for other safety issues/practices.
- i.** Chaperones must remember to stay hydrated and carry water in canteens or suitable containers at all times.
