What is Title I?

Bowdon Elementary is identified as a Title I High Progress school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with parents and family members a written parent and family engagement policy.

School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Bowdon Elementary will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. Bowdon Elementary values the contributions and involvement of parents and family members to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. How is it revised?

Bowdon Elementary School invited all parents to attend our annual School Forum in July to review and revise this parent and family engagement policy, as well as the schoolwide plan, our school-parent compact, and the family engagement budget. Additionally, parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year. The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey online and by mail to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for family engagement. Parents and family members can also give feedback during several parent meetings and activities during the school year. Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Bowdon Elementary will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the plan is included in the student handbook that is available to all students on-line or a paper copy may be requested through the front office. The plan will also be posted on the school website and social media. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center or in the front office.

2017–18 District Goals

All schools in the district will score above the state average as measured by the College and Career Readiness Performance Index (CCRPI).

2017–18 School Goals

On the 2017 CCRPI report, increase the CCRPI performance indicator in reading and mathematics by 5 percent points.

The focus for reading is:

PK–2: Beginning sounds, sight words and reading comprehension

PK–5: Vocabulary development, reading comprehension and comparing/contrasting with higher order thinking skills applied

The focus for math is:

PK–3: Place value and Number Sense

3–5: Numbers and Operations/ Fractions

Parent Math Night March 27, 2018




Parent and Family Engagement

Bowdon Elementary will take the following measures to promote and support parents and family members as an important foundation of the school in order to strengthen the school and reach our school goals. We will:

- ✓ Ensure that all information related to school and parent programs, meetings, and other activities is published in both English and Spanish when necessary, posted on the social media/school website, and included in the 9 weeks school newsletter for all families.
- ✓ Provide professional learning training for staff during their pre-planning on strategies to improve communication with parents and ideas to increase family engagement with reading and math activities for our students outside of the classroom.
