Our annual school-parent compact offers ways that we can work together to help our students succeed. This compact provides strategies to help connect learning at school and at home.

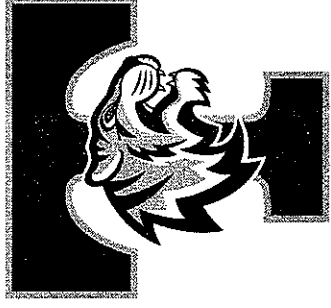

- ✓ The percentage of students scoring at Proficient or above on the Georgia Milestones (GMAS) English Language Arts End of Grade Assessment will increase by three percentage points.
- ✓ The percentage of students scoring at Proficient or above on the Georgia Milestones (GMAS) Mathematics End of Grade Assessment will increase by three percentage points.

School Goals

- ✓ Provide quality ongoing professional learning for teachers.
- ✓ Conduct three academic parent meetings collaborating with parents to meet the educational needs of students.
- ✓ Encourage parents to volunteer in classrooms, at school activities and to participate in parent teacher conferences

As parents, we will...

- ✓ Read to my child or have my child read to me for 30 minutes each day ensuring my child completes a reading log entry.
- ✓ Participate in the academic parent meeting math/literacy activities with my child prescribed on my child's SMART Goal form.
- ✓ Insure my child will have 80% - 100% passage rate on the STAR reading and math screener at each 90-day administration by using Marzano's Six Step Vocabulary processes each night for 15minutes.

As students, we will

- ✓ Participate in the reading program and set goals for earning points according to the books read with completed reading logs.
- ✓ Practice IXL in reading and math as prescribed by individual diagnostic.
- ✓ Practice the Six Step Marzano Vocabulary process in ELA and math with my parents as prescribed on my SMART Goal form.
- ✓ Utilize the Google classroom activities my teachers' prepare to improve my skill level in math, reading, and writing.
