Dear Parent(s)/Guardian(s):

The Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) of 1965 requires that parents or guardians who have children attending a Title I school be notified of how well their school is preparing its students for college and/or a career, as well as the school's designation status under Georgia's ESEA Flexibility Waiver.

Under Georgia's ESEA Flexibility Waiver, certain Title I schools are designated as Reward, Priority, Focus, or Alert schools. The Waiver also allows the use of the College and Career Ready Performance Index (CCRPI), which serves as a comprehensive report card for all schools in Georgia. The CCRPI provides a score between 0-100 for each school, and that score measures how well the school is doing in preparing its students to be successful in college and/or a career.

I am very proud to tell you that Villa Rica Elementary School has not been given a school designation this year, which means we are continuing to provide a quality education to all of our students.

Our Milestones data from 2015 reflects high levels of student achievement in the areas of Reading, Math, Science and Social Studies. 54% of all 3rd – 5th grade students were at the proficient or distinguished level in reading and 69% of all 3rd – 5th grade students were at the proficient or distinguished level in math, 61% of all 3rd – 5th grade students were at the proficient or distinguished level in science, and 64% were at the proficient or distinguished level in social studies.

At Villa Rica Elementary School, we take pride in the teaching we provide for our children. Our teachers and staff members work very hard to meet the needs of all students to ensure they achieve at their highest potential.

An important part of Villa Rica Elementary School's success is parent participation and support in developing activities to improve student achievement. We hope that you will become involved in our school improvement work as we continue to monitor student achievement and set high expectations.
