## **Testing Information**

Our students will take the GA Milestones (state test) beginning on April 24. Teachers have been discussing testing tips at school for the past several weeks and teaching them the standards they will need to know all year. There is a state requirement that students in 3<sup>rd</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grades meet minimum requirements in reading; additionally, 5<sup>th</sup> graders must meet a minimum score in math in order to meet state promotion requirements. Students who don't make the minimum score will have the chance to retake that portion of the GA Milestones May 22-23.

You can help by making sure your child gets plenty of rest on the nights before testing and that they eat a good breakfast either at home or at school. Encourage your child to do his or her best but not to stress!
