# From the Guidance Counselor

This year in Classroom Guidance we are talking about how to be "Change Makers". We are so fortunate to have a school full of students that strive to be their best and make each day count not only for themselves, but also others. I believe these kids have the potential to make big positive differences in our world for years to come and it all starts with developing character. During the month of September our character trait is Responsibility. Part of being a "Change Maker" means we are responsible in the following ways:

Responsible for:

- 1. our words and actions
- 2. our tasks and materials at school and at home
- 3. our commitments
- 4. being honest
- 5. doing our part in our classroom and community

# Talk about it at home:

Being responsible is a learned behavior! It takes time to teach responsibility and it requires patience to teach. With practice and clear expectations, you can teach your child to become a responsible learner:

- 1. Give chores that your child is expected to complete.
- 2. Remind your child the importance of asking questions if he or she doesn't understand a direction given.
- 3. Set a regular schedule for completing school work in the afternoon
- 4. Model behaviors and attitudes that promote learning, enthusiasm, and curiosity.

#### From the Nurse

Does the school nurse and teachers know about any medical conditions your child may have, particularly food allergies, asthma, diabetes, and any other conditions that may need to be managed during the school day?

Kids don't always listen when you tell them to wash their hands before eating, after using the bathroom, or when they come inside from playing, but it's a message worth repeating. Hand washing is by far the best way to prevent germs from spreading and to keep your kids from getting sick.

Flu season is just around the corner. Flu shots are arriving at your child's doctor's office. Call and schedule your student appointment.

Annual school health screenings for vision and hearing will be on Friday, October 5th. A copy of the results will be sent home with your child. Obviously optimal vision and hearing are necessary for optimal learning. Please follow up on a failed screening. Notify me if you have difficulty accessing a health care provider or if you have any questions. Remember the screenings done at school are just screenings and do not replace an evaluation by a professional. If your student passed the screening, but you notice difficulties or your student complains of difficulties you should have him/her examined by a professional.

Create a daily schedule for: waking up, eating breakfast, arriving to school on time, doing homework, enjoying free time, having dinner with the family, bathing, and packing up for the next day; and post daily chore list on fridge as a reminder.

PLEASE have a current and working phone number in the school office daily in the event your child needs your attention. Feel free to call me if you need assistance with any of the above.

#### From the Parent Coordinator

There is a new location for the Family Resource Center this year. We are located inside the Media Center in an office near the loft. The Family Resource Center has good information for parents on a number of different subjects including homework help, discipline, ADHD, building self-esteem, responsibility, good study habits, and lots more!
