With all the recent happenings in the country, I wanted to give you a few safety updates for both Catoosa County and Battlefield Elementary. Safety is our upmost concern in Catoosa County and at BES. We are always looking for ways to improve. In the most recent Education Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax (E-SPLOST), updating our safety equipment and drills was the number one goal of our school system. All schools in our county conduct regular safety drills throughout the year. Over the last year, all schools have installed and implemented the buzz-in system. For anyone we don't know, we are able to check their identification through the camera before allowing them into the building. Our schools have also been wired for the new Sielox system. Teacher trainings are currently taking place for this new system. The system should be fully implemented for the 2018/2019 school year. If an intruder were to enter our building, an alarm would sound. At this time, teachers would be able to view the cameras outside their classroom through either their phone, or a computer in the classroom and then make a decision to either "Run/Hide/ or Survive".

Just a few weeks ago, Mrs. Reese, our school superintendent announced that starting in the 2018/2019 school year, resource officers would be added to the elementary schools. We will be sharing an officer with Battlefield Primary. I'm extremely excited about this decision as both a parent and administrator.

I hope you feel secure in sending your child to school. We work hard to make sure our school is safe and students feel safe. A safe environment helps create a better learning environment.

We just finished our pet supply donation drive to support two of our local animal shelters.
