#### Practice sight words everyday!

Sight words are words that are learned by looking at them and not sounding them out. A good idea is to make flash cards with these words on them and review them nightly with your child. Knowing these words will help them become better readers.

The sight words are in your child's folder. Remember to start with list 1. Once your child has mastered list one he/she can move on to the next list. This is same for the letters I will put a smiley face at the bottom of the list when he/she are able to move on. Thanks!

### Helpful Hints for Home:

Work on fine-motor skills. Practice cutting with scissors and handwriting. Practice writing names and numbers 0-10. Have your child look around the house for items that begin with the /m/ /a/ /s/ sounds.

### Reading/Language Arts:

We are still learning rules and procedures for literacy centers and writer's workshop. We are always working and using our quiet voices. We are working on letters and sounds, sight words, syllables, and rhyming. In writing we are working on drawing pictures with a lot of detail. We are labeling our pictures and stretching out the words. In shared reading time we are working on story elements(characters, setting, problem, solution). We are working on beginning, middle, and end. We are also identifying the parts of the book (front cover, back cover, title page) and author and illustrator.

#### Math:

We are continuing to learn rules and procedures for math workshop.
