

### **RESPONSIBILITY**



At BPS, we encourage each of our students to be "Students of Character" by emphasizing certain Character Traits.

This month our school will focus on the importance of being **responsible**. To show responsibility means to take care of yourself and others, and to finish your task *carefully* and *completely*.

There are many ways to help teach your primary student about being responsible.

- Lead by example, and remember that there are many teachable moments throughout your daily lives.
- Consistent daily routines can help instill responsibility.
- Provide them with age-appropriate responsibilities to help with at home.
- Communicate with your child to help them understand when they are using responsible behavior and making good choices.
- Read books together. There are many good books out that relay the importance of being responsible -<u>Arthur's New Puppy</u> by Marc Brown and <u>The Boy Who</u> <u>Cried Wolf</u> by T. Ross are two examples of good books to read and discuss with your child.

### A Few Reminders about Car Pick-up

During the first couple of weeks of school, the car line is always much longer (and therefore slower) than the remainder of the year. Over the past couple of years, we have developed an excellent procedure for

dismissing students.



To help us ensure that we keep students safe and are as efficient as possible, we ask that you:

- $\Rightarrow$  Stay in the carpool line rather than come in the building. Someone will bring your child to your car.
- $\Rightarrow$  Put the hang tag with your child's name on the rearview mirror with the name facing out.
- $\Rightarrow$  Be respectful of other drivers and take turns at the merge areas.
- $\Rightarrow$  Drive slowly as you exit the carpool line.

Dismissal starts at 2:15 p.m. Our goal is to have our last car rider loaded by 3:00.

All office check-outs must be prior to 2:00 pm. This enables us to avoid any confusion when teachers are preparing to dismiss classes. As tempting as it is to park and come in to get your child, we insist you do not. Coming in requires that we interrupt the process of dismissal, which causes those waiting in the carpool line to have to wait longer. Safety is always our primary concern, and if parents walked into the dismissal area, we would have to ensure that the child was going with the correct person. We enlist the help of many staff members for our dismissal procedure and simply do not have enough to assign someone to help with dismissal from

within the building. So, my advice is to bring a bottle of water, a book to read, or a project to catch up on, and lots of patience. Remember, seeing that excited learner after a full day of school will be worth the wait.
