A Parent Compact for Student Achievement is an agreement that parents, students, and teachers develop together. It explains how parents and teachers will work

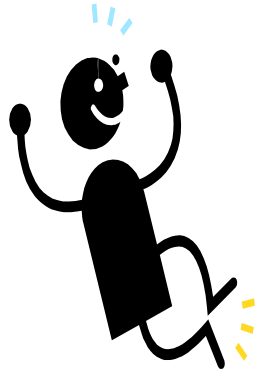
together to make sure all students get the individual support they need to meet and exceed grade level standards.

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Goals for Student Learning

District Goal: *To improve the percentage of students scoring proficient (levels 3, 4) in grades 3 through 8.*

To improve the percentage of students graduating from high school.

School Goal: *Increase the percentage of students who score in the developing learner or better categories in ELA by five percentage points on the GA Milestones.*

Increase the percentage of students who meet the grade level stretch band (lexile score) by five percentage points on the GA Milestones.



GES Fifth Grade Students

GES students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed and reach for the stars in language arts and reading. Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school:

- * Understand my lexile level and reach my AR goals.
- * Bring home newsletters and notices about family activities
- * Talk to my family about what I am learning about in language arts and reading.

GES Fifth Grade Teachers

Fifth Grade teachers will work with students and their families to support students' success in language arts and reading. Some of our key connections with families will be to:

- * Help students and families understand Lexile through the Lexile information video and information sent home throughout the year.
- * Keep the lines of communication open with families through emails, weekly folders, reports, phone calls, and family meetings.
- * Suggest books to read and discuss with their child based on student STAR Assessment scores and their Lexile level by providing a list of suggested books and discussion starters in monthly newsletter.
- * Help students and parents understand the concepts of the Georgia Standards of Excellence by providing information about what students are learning in the classroom.

GES Fifth Grade Parents

GES parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in language arts and reading. Families may have other ideas to add to this list.

- * Get my child to school on time.
- * Check my child's backpack daily.
- * Set aside a quiet place for my child to do homework and make sure he/she understands it.
