Working Together for School Success

Communication Counts...Build a strong relationship with your child's teacher by communicating regularly. Here are tips:

- Ask the teacher about the best way to contact her. Does she prefer email, notes in your youngster's backpack, or phone calls?
- Sign and return items as soon as possible. Your signature on a graded test or reading log communicates to the teacher that you're interested in how your child is doing.
- Your youngster's life at home can have a big impact on his life in school. Talk to the teacher right away about changes like new custody arrangements or a parent's military deployment. That way, you and the teacher will both be able to keep an eye out for any changes in his grades or behavior.

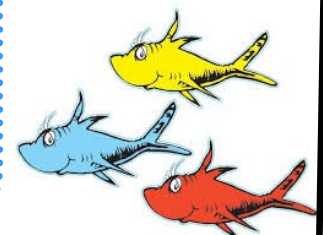
