# Educational Options for College Preparation

- Honors Classes are more challenging, more demanding and accelerated classes. Gifted, Honors and Accelerated Classes are synonymous in high school.

## Honors Program

- SAT (College Board) The nation's most widely used college admission test. The highest score possible is 1600. HHS average was 1169 in 2018.
- ACT "American College Test": Scale is 1 to 36 (English, Math, Reading and Science measured). HHS average score in 2018 was 21.3
- Advanced Placement (College Board) College level courses taught in high school: Scale is 1 to 5
- PSAT (College Board & National Merit Scholarship Corporation) pre-SAT to provide feedback to students 11<sup>th</sup> grade and younger on their college readiness skills
- ▶ FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) used almost universally for needs based scholarships.
- HOPE Scholarship funded by the Georgia Lottery for Georgia high school graduates.

## College Preparation Terms

- k How do you plan to finance college?
- & Consider Dual Enrollment options and schedule your classes accordingly.
- & Select Honors/AP Courses during registration. Push yourself!
- k If you are considering a math related career, start with Honors/Accelerated math classes.
- Meet with your school counselor if you are considering starting college early or considering a creative/unique way to earn your high school diploma.
- k Register for an account from collegeboard.com
  - ø College Board administers the SAT, PSAT and AP (Advanced Placement)
- k PSAT in October, 2019
  - ซ Cost is \$18
  - This is an excellent opportunity to determine a baseline to prepare for the SAT
  - ø College Test Parent Meeting to understand scores

#### Freshman Year

- & Schedule 2 foreign language classes

- № Parents and students talk about college goals. Consider public vs. private and profile colleges that interest you.

## Sophomore Year

- Regional Merit Scholarship Program
- & SAT and/or ACT

- & Begin to research scholarship opportunities
- k Identify colleges that interest you and determine admission requirements
- & Consider ACT or SAT preparation
- □ Dual Enrollment at GNTC or Dalton State?

## Junior Year

- *▶* Dual Enrollment?
- ₹ Take up to 3 college visits (count as field trips)
- Apply for scholarships
  - ø Deadlines typically in Nov.-April
  - ø Many require an essay, which can be re-used
- & SAT
- & ACT
- & Complete SAT/ACT prep to get the score you want
- & AP Exams in May

#### Senior Year

#### & Requirements

- ø 3.0 or higher GPA in high school classes
- Pays about \$4,000 a year toward private Georgia colleges
- Must have 4 rigor classes in high school
- maintain 3.0 GPA in college to keep scholarship
- Zell Miller Scholarships pays 100% tuition to Georgia public colleges and universities
  - ষ 3.7 core GPA
  - ষ 1200 SAT (Critical Reading and Math) or 26 ACT
  - ম Maintain 3.3 GPA in college to keep scholarship

## HOPE Scholarship

- Require high school diploma, but do accept GED

- ∀ Heritage High's college prep curriculum prepares you for success at this level.
- & Entrance exam will be administered at HHS

## Technical College

- k Require 2.0 GPA
- ⋈ Heritage High's college prep curriculum prepares you for success at this level, however some programs have more rigorous demands.

#### 2 Year Public Community Colleges

- & SAT (minimum 330 Critical Reading, 310 Math)
- & ACT (minimum 14 English, 12 Math)
- - ø Average Freshman GPA is 3.10
  - ø Average ACT is 19

  - g Tuition is \$3,126
- Our college prep curriculum will prepare students for **admission** to Dalton State, but students need Honors for **success** at Dalton State.

  - \$26,688 total cost (room, board, books, living expenses, tuition)

  - ø 48% acceptance rate
  - ø High school GPA 3.97-4.21
  - я ACT average 28-33
  - g SAT average 1400
  - ø 99% took at least one advanced level course (AP, IB, or Dual Enrollment)
  - ø Earned an average of 20 semester hours in AP/Dual Enrollment
  - g 97% took their school's "advanced" or "most difficult" curriculum



## University of Georgia

- ₹ 7 Public University in the Nation (U.S. News, 2015)
- & Average Freshman Profile 2018
  - ø Admission Rate was 37% in state (19% overall)

  - ø ACT average was 31-34
  - Students averaged 8-13 AP/IB/Dual Enrollment classes in high school
  - ø Average high school GPA was 4.0
  - ø 95% took at least AP Calculus in high school



## Georgia Tech

- ★ Annual Tuition: \$35,176
  - \$50,632 with tuition, room, board
  - ø Average Freshman Financial Aid is \$26,668
- - ø Average GPA 3.74

  - ø 62% Acceptance Rate



## Berry College

### College Credit in High School

- & AP is a national college curriculum developed by the College Board
- & AP teachers attend training to become certified
- Students may take an AP exam in May (\$91) to attempt to earn college credit for the course. 
  Students may take 1 STEM AP exam for free.
- AP exams are scored on a 5 point scale with students receiving credit based on scores between 3-5 depending upon the individual college/university

#### □ Dual Enrollment

- ø College level coursework for credit in high school and toward college graduation
- Available for any eligible 10<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade student depending on college and program of study
  - ষ Georgia Northwestern Tech offers beginning in 10<sup>th</sup> grade
  - য় Dalton State offers beginning in 11th grade
- ø Can be full time or part time
- ø State funded
- ø Must meet college admission (test and GPA) requirements
- work through HHS School Counselors to apply and choose classes
- ø FREE SUMMER CLASSES

- ∀ Talk to your counselor

- Apply for college

#### Steps to take for Dual Enrollment

- & AP Programs are *typically* more rigorous
- & Dual Enrollment classes have clearly defined results.
- When students take college at the post-secondary institution, students are treated like college age students.
- Representation This will be a personal decision as well as a course by course decision.
- & Students must meet regular college admission guidelines

- & Some college programs have age requirments
