Goals for Student Achievement

District Goals:

1. To improve the percentage of students scoring proficient (levels 3, 4) in grades 3 through 8
2. To improve the percentage of students graduating from high school

School Goals:

1. RES will focus on reading strategies that will promote student growth in Lexile level achievement by at least one grade level as measured by May, 2019 STAR benchmarks.
 - 5th grade will focus on reading comprehension at Lexile level as a *specific* skill area.
2. RES will focus on math strategies that will promote student growth in number sense understandings in order to achieve at least a 5% gain in Levels 3 and 4 as measured by the May, 2019 Georgia Milestones Assessment.
 - 5th grade will focus on fact fluency and number sense as *specific* skill areas..

In the 5th Grade Classroom

The 5th grade classroom will work with students and their families to support students' success in reading and math. Some of our key connections with families will be:

- Provide links to sites such as Reading Wonders or ReadWorks to increase reading comprehension
- Provide a library book within a child's Zone of Proximal Development (area that is most appropriate for the child to comprehend what they are reading)
- Provide links to sites such as IXL to increase student skills and increase fact fluency

5th Grade Ringgold Elementary Students

5th Grade Ringgold Elementary students joined staff to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school and reach for the stars in math and reading. Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school.

- Complete homework and then review my answers with my parents
- Use website links my teacher provides to help me with math and reading
- Read every night at home

At Home

Ringgold Elementary School parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in reading and math. Families may have other ideas to add to this list.

- Practice math facts and math games at home and look for opportunities to explore math at home
- Practice reading at home by reading daily with my child, working on sight words, or using Reading Wonders educational computer games at home
- Look for and read the class newsletter to stay informed about what my child is learning in class and use the information to support their learning at home
