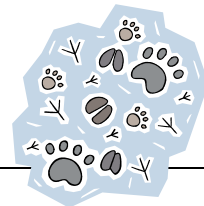

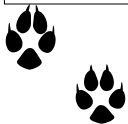

RES 4th Grade Teachers

The 4th Grade teachers will work with students and their families to support student success. Some of our key connections with families will be:

1. Encourage parent participation in the classroom by maintaining open communication.
2. Provide parents with computer Assisted Instruction (CAI) to participate with their child's learning, i.e., Front Row, IXL, Scholastic News, Khan Academy, etc....
3. Provide study guides to increase parent support and involvement with child's learning.
4. Provide hard copies and links for parents to increase understanding of important influences on child development, i.e., nutrition, communication, health, discipline, etc.

At Home

RES parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support student success:

- Check my child's backpack daily.
- Stay in contact with my child's teachers through conferences, emails, notes, phone calls, etc.
- Get my child to school on time.
