Course Description: Sophomore English Literature and Composition integrates writing, grammar and usage,

vocabulary, literature, speaking, listening, viewing, and critical thinking skills. The course presents the writing process and the various modes of writing along with a study of various genres of literature. The course is designed to meet the AP and GPS/Common Core Standards which can

be accessed at www.doe.k12.ga.us. Note: Honors classes do get progressively more rigorous at

each grade level.

Required Materials: Secure a copy of the **Summer Reading** letter and complete the assignments BEFORE school

begins in August. Acquire the following materials: loose leaf notebook paper, a three-ringed binder, blue or black ink pens (**no** other colors accepted), pencil, one pack of 3 x 5 white, lined index cards, various outside novels, access to email, access to a computer *with* **Microsoft Word**

and access to a printer. A flash drive is also highly recommended.

Homework: Please expect homework <u>nightly!!!</u> The majority of homework will consist of <u>reading</u> and

studying along with various writing assignments. Honors students should expect up to **5-10** hours of homework weekly which is the **AP** standard. Please respect all deadlines and refrain from using excuses such as: "I had company last night," or "I had band practice," or "I play sports," or "I had to go to youth group," or "My computer is broken." All assignments have adequate time allotted

Honors Late Work Policy: Late work will NOT be accepted. All assignments must be ON TIME, EVERY TIME! Turning

in late work and producing poor quality work are unbecoming behaviors for an honor student to display. Extenuating circumstances must be just that...extenuating! *Parents, please initial:

Outside Reading: Students will be required to complete a catalogue of outside reading material <u>in addition</u> to the in-

class reading. Outside readings include: 4-6 AP novels, articles, essays, and research materials. Reading is **a major component** for success in this class. Each reading project will be assessed in various assignments: writing, speaking, testing, etc. Class novels belong to RHS and Mr. Pierce.

Keeping novels and selling them to McKay's would be unethical.

Writing Portfolio: Students will be required to produce a variety of writing samples. Writing samples will be used to

measure student achievement and ability. The evidence in the writing portfolio will be a major

determiner for recommendation to the next grade level of Honors English.

Pre, Mid, and Post Tests: Students will be tested at the beginning, middle, and end of the course in the form of a diagnostic

writing essay and/or a Georgia Performance Standards-based examination.

Alternative Assessments: A variety of assessments may be used to evaluate students. Each assessment is designed to meet

Georgia Performance Standards. Alternative assessments may include but are not limited to the following: speeches, presentations, collaborative groups, skits, peer-editing, group projects,

debate, discussion, etc. Over, please →

Extra Help:	Please notify the instructor <u>immediately</u> if additional help is needed. We are here to help students succeed. Please keep in mind that honors students are expected to work at an accelerated pace and at an advanced level.				
Grading Procedure:	For the final grade, homework/class work/tests/quizzes/speaking will count 80% (which is 40% per 9 week term). The final examination will count 20% of the final grade. Final exam exemption may apply; see handbook for details. Within each 9 week term, daily grades will count 50% and test grades will count 50%.				
Parent Notification:	Each parent/guardian will be contacted a <u>minimum</u> of 4 times during each semester. Every 4 ½ weeks, a progress report or a report card will be available via Parent Portal. Other contacts may be made on an as needed basis <u>only</u> . Parents now have web access to <i>Infinite Campus</i> which will serve as a 24/7 ongoing contact. It is imperative that parents make use of this resource! <i>Please note: English teachers require additional time to post essay grades as the grading time is immense.</i>				
Attendance:	Students are required to be at school! It is the parent/guardian's responsibility to <u>ensure</u> that students are in school <u>every</u> day and on time every day. Board policy allows 5 days for <u>emergency</u> absences only (illness, bereavement, etc.) Over five unexcused absences will result in failure. Attendance is REQUIRED!
