---Important Deadlines--FAFSA application opened October 1st

The sooner you complete it the quicker you learn about financial aid! (required by all colleges)

University of Tennessee at Chattanooga campus tour Thursday, Nov. 15th

We will leave RHS at 8:05am and the tour will begin at 9:00am. Must sign up in the guidance office, limited to the first 40 seniors to turn in the signed permission from and turn in \$5 to cover cost of transportation.

<u>GA Apply to College Day</u> November 16th 8:30-2:30 in the RHS Media Center Counselors and college admissions officers will assist you with applying to the schools of your choice. Several colleges will waive their application fee on this day.

- *Dalton State College campus group tour Nov. 30th 9:30a (We will leave RHS at 8:45) must sign up in the guidance office, limited to the first 40 seniors to turn in the signed permission from and turn in \$5 to cover cost of transportation.
- *Kennesaw State University campus tour Wednesday, January 30th We will be leaving RHS at approx. 7:30a and the tour will begin promptly at 10:00am. Must sign up in the guidance office, limited to the first 40 seniors to turn in the signed permission from and turn in \$10 to cover cost of transportation.

College Application Timeline

September

- ✓ Your counselor plays a big role in helping you get into college, so keep her informed. Meet to talk about your college plans and review your transcript.
- ✓ Get started on your applications right away if you plan to apply through an early decision or early action program. Deadlines for early applications tend to fall in October or November.
- Start working on your college essays. Write essays that focus on your experiences and make you stand out from the crowd.

✓ October

- Ask your counselor, teachers, and coaches or employers for letters of recommendation. Give them plenty of time to meet your deadlines and make sure to provide them with stamped and addressed envelopes.
- ✓ Take ACT/SAT tests. Make sure your scores are sent to each of your colleges.
- ✓ If you are applying under an early decision or early action program, be sure to get all forms in as soon as possible. Applying online might be the right option for you.

✓ November

- Submit early decision and early action applications on time.
- ✓ Work hard at completing your college essays. Proofread them rigorously for mistakes.
- ✓ Follow up with your teachers to ensure that letters of recommendation are sent on time to meet your deadlines.
- Mail applications as early as possible for colleges with rolling deadlines (admissions decisions are made as applications are received).

✓ December

- ✓ Try to wrap up college applications before winter break. Make copies of each application before you send it.
- ✓ Early decision and early application responses arrive this month.

✓ January

- ✓ Early decision and early application responses arrive this month.
- ✓ Some colleges include your first-semester grades as part of your application folder. This is called the mid-year grade report. Have your counselor send your grades to colleges that require them.

✓ February

- ✓ Contact your colleges and confirm that all necessary application materials have been received.

✓ March

✓ Some admissions decisions arrive this month. Read everything you receive carefully, as some of it may require action on your part.


✓ April

- Most admissions decisions and financial aid award letters arrive this month. Read everything you
 receive carefully, as some of it may require action on your part.
- ✓ Make a final decision, and mail the enrollment form and deposit check to the school you select before May 1 (the enrollment deadline for most schools).
- Notify each of the schools to which you were accepted that you will not be attending in writing so that your spot can be freed up for another student.
- ✓ On the waiting list? Contact the admissions office and let them know of your continued interest in the college and update them on your spring semester grades and activities.

✓ May

- ✓ AP Exams are administered. Make sure your AP score report is sent to your college.
- ✓ Study hard for final exams. Most admissions offers are contingent on your final grades.
- ✓ Thank your counselor, teachers, coaches, and anyone else who wrote you recommendations or
 otherwise helped with your college applications.

SAT and SAT Subject Tests

The SAT is a globally available test accepted by all U.S. and many international colleges and universities. It is offered seven times a year in the United States and U.S. territories, and four times a year internationally. Visit sat.org to learn more.

SAT SUBJECT TESTS

The SAT Subject Tests™ are hour-long, content-based tests that let students distinguish themselves in the college admission process by highlighting their strengths and interests in specific subject areas, including math, science, history, literature, and languages. satsubjecttests.org

PRACTICE

The College Board and Khan Academy' have partnered to offer free, personalized practice for the SAT Suite of Assessments. Students can visit Khan Academy at **satpractice.org** to get SAT practice resources based on their results for any test in the SAT Suite of Assessments (SAT, PSAT/NMSQT*, PSAT™ 10, or PSAT™ 8/9).

Students can also visit sat.org/practice to access a free official SAT practice app, full SAT practice tests, and sample SAT questions.

To prepare for SAT Subject Tests, students can access free online practice questions at satsubjecttests.org as well as video lesson playlists for science subjects from Khan Academy.

FEE WAIVERS

Eligible students who demonstrate financial need can take two free SAT tests, with or without the essay, and six free SAT Subject Tests (they can take their free Subject Tests during two registrations and schedule up to three tests each time). Fee waivers cover unlimited score reports sent to colleges, waived application fees at participating colleges, and free CSS Profile™ applications to apply for financial aid from participating schools.
