## Goals for Student Learning

### District Goal:

- To improve the percentage of students scoring proficient (levels 3, 4) in grades 3 — 8.
- To improve the percentage of students graduating from high school.

### School Goals:

- 3% Increase in Georgia Milestones ELA in grades 3rd —5th
- 3% Increase in Georgia Milestones Math in grades 3rd —5th
- 3% Increase in Georgia Milestones SCI & SS in grades 3rd —5th

### Grade-Level Goals:

- In ELA our grade level will focus on written responses and reading comprehension.
- In Math our grade level will focus on Number and Operations in Base Ten and Number and Operations—Fractions.

## TCE 4th Grade Teachers

The 4th Grade teachers will work with students and their families to support learning.

- Provide math information and websites such as IXL and Xtra Math to practice fact fluency and math skills.
- Suggest websites such as IXL to practice ELA skills and offer books for nightly reading.

## TCE 4th Grade Students

TCE students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed. Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school:

- Do my homework every night.
- Pay close attention in class and study hard.
- Use Xtra Math at home and read at home every night.

## At Home
