#### **NOTES FROM NURSE AMANDA:**

On November 8th, the Catoosa County school nurses will come to our school to perform vision and hearing screenings on students in 1st, 3rd and 5th grades. If your student passes the screening you will receive notification of a passed screening. If your student does not pass you will receive a notice of failure along with a copy of the failed screening to be taken to a professional for follow up. Obviously, optimal vision and hearing are necessary for optimal learning. Please follow up on a failed screening. Notify me if you have difficulty accessing a health care provider or if you have any questions. Remember the screenings done at school are just screenings and do not replace an evaluation by a professional. If your student passed the screening but you notice difficulties or your student complains of difficulties you should have him/her examined by a professional.
