What is Title !?

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GOALS FOR STUDENT LEARNING

District Goal

To improve the percentage of students scoring proficient (levels 3, 4) in grades 3 through 8.

To improve the percentage of students graduating from high school.

School Goals

- 87% of 3rd, 4th & 5th grade students will meet or exceed <u>math</u> standards.
- 89% of 3rd, 4th, & 5th grade students will meet or exceed science standards.
- 100% of All Students will be provided a safe and secure learning environment.





School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

How is it developed? Tiger Creek Elementary School welcomes parent input and comments at any time regarding the plan. All parent feedback will be used to revise the plan for next year. The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and post feedback throughout the year. We also distribute an annual survey asking parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for parent involvement.

Who is it for? All families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Tiger Creek will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents with limited English, parents with disabilities, and parents of migratory children.

Where is it available? The plan is available at <u>all</u> parent meetings and at <u>tce.catoosa.k12.ga.us</u>. Parents can obtain a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center (available in other languages upon request).

Parents are their children's first and most important teachers. Research tells us that parent involvement makes a big difference. When schools welcome families, establish personal relationships among families and staff, help parents understand how the system works, and encourage family-staff collaboration to improve student achievement, students do better in school, and in return, the school gets better.

For these reasons, we will abide by these statements:

- **1.)** Tiger Creek Elementary School (TCE) has developed this policy jointly with parents on April 27, 2016 and is distributing it to the parents of children in this school and to the community. The Policy is distributed in many ways. Example: Title I events, Fall Festival, Partnership meetings.
- **2.)** It will be our practice to convene an annual meeting at a convenient time, inviting and encouraging all parents to attend. The annual meeting will be held at a convenient time where parents will be informed about participation, and will receive information explaining Title I, its requirements, and parents' rights to be involved.
- **3.)** Meetings for parents will be scheduled at various times in order to allow parents flexibility to fit their schedules. TCE School will seek to eliminate barriers to attendance when possible. The parent involvement coordinator will be on hand to help with car pooling. Trans-aid is also available during the day to bring parents to the school. Some of the opportunities for 2016-2017 are:

- **4.)** TCE School seeks to involve all parents in an organized, ongoing, timely way in planning, revising, and improving the Title I program. This includes TCE School's Parent Involvement Policy and the school-wide plan each being revisited several times a year through Parent Advisory Council, regular school-wide meetings, and the Annual Meeting. An annual survey will be collected in March. Information gleaned from these surveys will be used in the revision process.
 - **5.)** TCE School will provide parents timely information regarding:
 - *Title I programs in the school
 - *Results of the annual state-wide assessments including school performance profiles
 - *Individual student's assessment results and interpretations of those results
 - *Other assessments used to measure student progress and the proficiency levels the students are expected to meet

- *A description and explanation of the school curriculum
- *Student progress—report cards, progress reports, CCRPI score, and campus portal are ways TCE provides this information to parents
- *Responses to parent suggestions
- *Collection of all unsatisfactory parent comments regarding the school and attach those comments to the school-wide plan and submit to the Catoosa County Title I Office
- **6.)** Parents have the right to request regular meetings, and in keeping with what it means to be a Title I school, TCE School will provide assistance to parents in such areas as:
 - *State Standards
 - *School improvement status and actions
 - *Components of the school-wide plan
 - *State Assessments
 - *Requirements of Title I
 - *Ways to monitor their children's progress
 - *Ways to participate in decisions relating to the education of their children

This will be accomplished through:

- *Newspaper article *Calendars *Flyers *Newsletters *Letters *Announcements

 *Handouts *Student handbook *Student agendas *Parent handbooks

 *Regular meetings *Text messages
- 7.) The Parent Involvement Program of TCE School will provide training/opportunities such as:
 - *Referral to the Catoosa County Literacy Center
 - *Training to help parents work with their children to improve their children's achievement (some of the workshops are listed on the second page)
- 8.) School personnel will be educated regarding:
 - *The value and utility of contributions of parents
 - *How to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners
 - *Implementation of parent programs
 - *Building ties between home and school

This will be completed partly by scheduled staff meetings, staff education and emails from the parent involvement coordinator, principal and/or school coach.

9.) TCE School values coordination in the Parent Involvement Program with agencies and partnerships. Some of the agencies and programs TCE School will be working with are:

*Head Start *Pre-K *Parents as Teachers *Public Preschools

Activities provided at the school will be forwarded to each of the above with information about the Title I activity and who to contact at TCE School. Each agency will be provided with a list of items in the resource center, if requested.

10.) TCE School has developed a strong community-based organization that partners businesses and school community together through its Partnership 2000 and Communities in School's Program.

- **11.)** TCE School provides opportunities for parents to learn about child development, issues dealing with child-rearing, and information to determine if developmental milestones are being met. These activities are provided at optimal times for parents to allow full partnership in their child's education.
- **12.)** Parents at TCE School participate in both ongoing and end-of-the-year evaluations that assist in measuring program effectiveness.
- **13.)** TCE School provides opportunities for LEP parents, parents of migratory children, and parents with disabilities, to be informed on all parent programs and activities in a language format that parents understand. Interpreters will be provided as needed.
- **14.)** Parents at TCE School benefit from other parent involvement activities that have been requested or recommended through surveys, school council, or PTO, including GED referrals.
- **15.)** Parents at TCE School are involved jointly in the development of the school-parent compact. The school-parent compact outlines how each party will be involved in the responsibility for student learning. The compact is based on county goals and school goals. Input is gathered from teachers, parents, and students and is written into the compact. After parent approval, the compact is signed by teacher, parent, and student. During parent-teacher conferences, the compact is used as a helpful tool.
- **16.)** TCE School is committed to providing quality curriculum and instruction that enables students served under Title I to meet performance standards in an effective learning environment.
- 17.) TCE School promotes good communication between parents and teachers on an ongoing basis through:
 - *Parent-teacher conferences, at least annually, during which the compact is discussed and how it relates to children's achievement
 - *Students' nightly agendas/folders
 - *Progress reports to parents on their children's progress
 - *Newsletters
 - *Opportunities to volunteer and participate at their child's school
 - *School web page
 - *Letters/notes home
 - *Text messages

Take-home activities written by system parent involvement coordinators correlate to state standards and may be requested through the parent involvement coordinator.

The Catoosa County Learning Center offers literacy, technology and GED training free of charge to adults in Catoosa County. The parent involvement coordinator can give you more details. The Catoosa County Collaborative offers parenting skills classes.

Monitoring child progress and how to improve academic performance will take place throughout the year. Workshops will be available to help parents with the Parent Portal and homework websites. All curriculum nights focus on student achievement.

School-Parent Compacts

As part of this plan. TCE School and our families will develop a school-parent compact, which is an agreement that parents, teachers, and students will develop together that explains how parents and teachers will work together to make sure all our students reach grade-level standards. The grade-specific **compacts** stress the importance of communication between parents and teachers. Parents, students, and teachers sign these compacts indicating the role each has in the education process. TCE parents are given the opportunity to provide input into their role at the start of the school year. Teachers agree on how they will keep parents informed, and then work with students to guide them in writing their promises in achieving their best. Grade-specific compacts are developed and are at Parent Orientation. Parents have the opportunity to review and adjust them. Official compacts are approved at the fall PAC meeting, which each and every parent is invited to attend. Compacts are then distributed for signatures and returned to the school by October 31st. *Compacts should be used at home and at school in parent and student conferences*.
