Goals for Student Learning

District Goals:

- To improve the percentage of students scoring proficient (levels 3, 4) in grades 3 through 8.
- To improve the percentage of students graduating from high school

School Target Goals:

- A 3% increase of all students will demonstrate proficiency (pass rate) in scale score in mathematics by 6/30/2019 as measured by percentages of students scoring at Developing learner or above on the GA Milestones Assessment
- A 3% increase of all students will demonstrate proficiency (pass rate) in scale score in English/Language Arts by 6/30/2019 as measured by percentages of students scoring at Developing learner or above on the GA Milestones Assessment
- In ELA our grade level will focus on vocabulary development and reading comprehension.
- In Math our grade level will focus on multiplication and division facts.

Third Grade Student Goals:

WSE students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed and reach for the stars in math and language arts. Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school:

- Learn 3rd grade standards.
- Complete and go beyond required units in Lexia and Symphony.
- Write every day for 10 minutes.
- Read every day for 15 minutes.
- Study math facts every day.

Third Grade Teacher Goals:

WSE teachers will work with students and their families to support students' success in language arts and math. Some of our key connections with families will be:

- Send home a weekly newsletter that will include reading activities that families can use to increase reading comprehension.
- Provide families materials for multiplication and division practice at home.

Third Grade Parent Goals:

WSE parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in language arts and math.

- Set aside a quiet place for my child to do homework and make sure my child completes their homework.
- Read together and discuss books at home daily.
- Stay in touch with my child's teacher through conferences, emails, notes and phone calls, etc, regarding ELA and math.
