






















Counselors Corner

Tis Better to Give... Dr. Lane

The holiday season that is now upon us means different things to everyone. Of, course, there are the traditional celebrations of the season as well as some not-so-traditional. For some of us, the holidays mean travel to visit loved ones, while for others it means having loved ones visit you. For many of us, the holidays are a time of joy. However, the month of December can be extremely stressful. Perhaps you experience all of these and more.

For your children, however, the holidays mean pretty much one thing only: getting gifts of the latest and greatest toys. Every day I see that far-away look in their eyes, and I know they are not dreaming of a white Christmas, but more likely a giant Batman or princess Barbie. You know the look I'm talking about. And you also know the look you get from your child when they open their "dream" present - and the feeling you get when you get that look. It's the feeling of joy: the Joy of Giving.

If we believe "It is better to give than to receive" is true, then we parents have a tremendous responsibility to teach the importance of giving to our children, who otherwise would only know the "joy of getting." And the best way to do that is to model giving and include your children in the process.
