



I love my job because I get to work with all of our students throughout the year. I tell students that my main job at WES is to help them to be safe, happy, and healthy kids who will one day become happy, healthy and successful adults.

<u>What does a School Counselor do?</u> A School Counselor is a person who:

- Listens to every child.
