What is a Title I school?

Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), Title I, Part A Section 1116 provides financial assistance to state and local agencies to meet the needs of at-risk children. The goal of Title l is to provide instructional services and activities which support students in meeting the state's challenging performance standards.

WES participates in a Title l Schoolwide Program

This means that ALL students receive the benefits of being in a Title I school.

What are our school's Title I (schoolwide) requirements?


The purpose of schoolwide Title I programs is to improve the entire educational program in a school. This should result in improving the academic achievement of ALL students, particularly the lowest achieving students.

What are our schoolwide goals?

- 1. In Kindergarten and 1st grade, Woodstation students will show growth on Easy CBM in reading. Grades 2 and 3 will show 30% (adequate growth) on STAR Reading. Grades 4 and 5 will show growth on Georgia Milestones. Growth targets identified by May 2019.
- 2. By May 2019, all students will show growth of 30% in their STAR Math Assessment for grades 1st through 5th grade and using EasyCBM in Kindergarten.
- **3.** Increase the number of students scoring at Proficient Learner, or Level 3, and Distinguished Learner, or Level 4, on the Georgia Milestones Assessment.
- 4. Increase the number of students scoring at Proficient Learner, or Level 3, and Distinguished Learner, or Level 4, in Science and Social Studies according to the Georgia Milestones Assessment.

What programs/supports are in place to help my child?

At WES we offer different programs to support our students. Some of these include:

- After school tutoring
- Book clubs in the Media Center before school
- Intervention time in our school schedule
- Extra learning programs for students including Lexia,
 Reading Plus, Symphony Math and Ascend Math

What curriculum does our school use?

Catoosa County Schools use the state adopted standards as the basis of curriculum. Currently the adopted curriculum is the **Georgia Standards** of Excellence. These standards provide clear expectation for instruction, assessment, and student work. Teachers are encouraged to use instructional frameworks which include an opening, work session, and closing for the delivery of instruction. Pacing guides and curriculum units called "frameworks" are some of the resources used to support the implementation of the Georgia Standards of Excellence.

What tests will my child be taking this school year?

Students in grades 3-5 will take the <u>Georgia Milestones Assessment in the spring</u>. Instruction is centered on the Georgia Standards of Excellence. The Georgia Milestones rely on the Georgia Student Growth Model (GSGM) initiative designed to provide students, parents, educators, and the public with important information on student progress.

Academic achievement only tells part of the story. The addition of student growth tells a more complete story about the academic performance of students. Now we not only know where students ended up, but we also know how much progress they made to get there.

How do these test measure my child's progress?

These test measure student growth from year to year in Reading, Writing (ELA) and Math. Students will score in one of four levels.

Level 1: Beginning Learner

Level 2: Developing Learner

Level 3: Proficient Learner

Level 4: Distinguished Learner

Does my child's teacher meet professional qualifications?

All teachers at Woodstation Elementary School are highly qualified in the content area they are teaching.

At Woodstation Elementary School, we are very proud of our teachers and feel they are prepared to give your child a high quality education. As a Title I school, we must meet federal regulations related to teacher qualifications as defined in ESSA. These regulations allow you to learn more about your childs teachers' training and credentials. We are happy to provide this information to you.

What is Parent's Right to Know?

At any time, you may ask:

- Whether the teacher met state qualifications and certification requirements for the grade level and subject he/she is teaching
- Whether the teacher received an emergency or conditional certificate through which state qualifications were waived
- What undergraduate or graduate degrees the teacher holds, including graduate certificates and additional degrees, and major(s) or area(s) of concentration
- You may also ask whether your child received help from a paraprofessional, and information about the paraprofessional's qualifications.
