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What is Title I?

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Coffee High School will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. We value the contributions and involvement of parents and family members. Parents play an integral role in assisting their child's learning and academic success. We encourage parents to be actively involved in their child's education and become full partners in the decision-making process by serving on advisory committees to assist in developing a plan and strategies to improve their child's academic progress.

How is it revised?

Coffee High School invites all parents to attend our annual Title 1 meeting to receive general information regarding Title 1 and how such funds are used in schools to support student learning. Parents are also encouraged to attend additional meetings throughout the school year to provide input or suggestions into the revision of the parent and family engagement policy/plan, the schoolwide plan, our school-parent compact, and the family engagement budget. Parents are also encouraged to provide electronic feedback or utilize the parents' suggestion boxes located in our parent resource center. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. Parents are also asked to participate in an annual survey online to provide their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for family engagement. Parents and family members can also give feedback during parent meetings or other scheduled activities throughout the year.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Coffee High School will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members of students with limited English and migratory children and students with disabilities.

Where is it available?

The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view as well as in our parent resource center located in the main entrance lobby. The plan will also be posted on social media and distributed through PeachJar. Parents can also obtain a copy of the plan at open house in the fall.

The Coffee County School System will increase the percentage of students scoring at the Developing Level or above in English Language Arts and Mathematics on The Georgia Milestones End of Grade (EOG) Assessment.

2019-2020 School Goals

Coffee High School will increase by 3 percent the percentage of students scoring at the Developing Level or above on the Georgia Milestones End of Course (EOC) Assessment in the areas of geometry and American Literature

School-Parent Compacts

As part of this plan, Coffee High School and our families will develop a school-parent compact, which is an agreement that parents, teachers, and students will develop that explains how parents and teachers will work together to make sure all our students reach grade-level standards. The compacts will be reviewed and updated annually based on feedback from parents, students, and teachers during annual meetings and designated school - community events. School-parent compacts are also shared with parents during parent-teacher conferences and kept with each child's teacher if parents need another copy.

Gain knowledge about topics relevant to your child's education and how you can support them at home.

Connect with the school and community to build a better school and review school plans.

Parent Appreciation and Feedback Forum - April 2020

Celebrate family engagement and the recognition of its impact on school and student success.

Grad Parent Night and What to Expect Your Senior Year Parent Nights - May 2020

A forum for parents and family members to participate in roundtable discussions with the principal and staff regarding the schoolwide plan, parent and family engagement policy, school-parent compacts, and the family engagement budget.
