## Building Partnerships

Annette Winn Elementary School provides many opportunities that parents can utilize to help their children succeed. The Parent Resource Center (PRC) offers a variety of resources such as educational games, books, workbooks and other materials. Parents may use materials in the center, or they may take advantage of the lending library which is available at the center. The lending library provides parents with an opportunity to check-out resources for home use. There are also parent workshops and meetings scheduled throughout the year that include topics such as math, and science workshops, Homework Help and Test Taking Strategies. The AWES Newsletter is sent home and it includes more information on family engagement activities at our school. Our Kindergarten-fourth grade classes will be conducting APTT ( Academic Parent Teacher Team) meetings. During these meetings, teachers will present data and activities to help parents work with their children at home.

## Communication about Student Learning

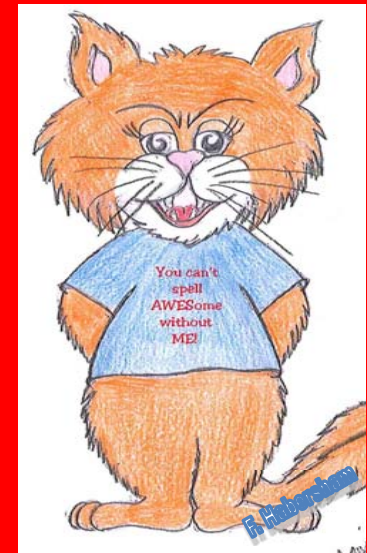
Annette Winn Elementary School is committed to frequent two-way communication with families about children's learning. Some of the ways you can expect us to reach you include the following:

## Our Goals for Student Achievement

### Douglas County School System Goals

The percentage of students scoring at Developing Learner or above on the Georgia Milestones (GMAS) English Language Arts End of Grade Assessments will increase by five percentage points.

### Annette Winn Elementary School Goals

**Math:** At least 80% of the students in grades kindergarten through fifth grade will earn a score of Developing Learner or higher on the Georgia Milestone Assessment.

## TEACHERS, PARENTS, STUDENTS TOGETHER FOR SUCCESS

### IN OUR FIFTH GRADE CLASSROOM

The fifth grade teachers will work with students and their families to support student success in reading and math. We will work with students and families in the following ways:

- ◆ Provide parents with the Eureka Math Parent Tips to assist with math content at home.
- ◆ Provide weekly reading passages that integrate science and social studies. These will be used at home to enhance reading skills.
- ◆ Provide an opportunity for students to checkout books from the media center as well as provide the login for the online program MyOn for at home readings.
- ◆ Assign writing responses using prompts from reading selections

### AT HOME

Annette Winn Elementary School parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in reading and math. Some of our key at-home activities will be:

- ◆ Review the Parent Tips that are sent home to ensure that we are aware of the expectations in mathematics and the topics taught in each module.
- ◆ Use resources provided to help enhance reading skills.
- ◆ Utilize MyOn and/or books to read various types of text and provide an area for my child to read daily for at least 20 minutes every night.
- ◆ Reading and review writing assignments to ensure that they have been completed.

### ANNETTE WINN ELEMENTARY SCHOOL STUDENTS

Annette Winn Elementary School students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school and reach for the stars in reading and math. Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school:

- ◆ Complete the activities shared in the Parent Tips at home with my parent(s)/guardian(s) to help with my understanding of what will be covered in the Eureka math modules.
- ◆ Complete all activities such as reading and fluency passages graphic organizers, and open-ended response questions in class and for homework.
- ◆ Read for at least 20 minutes a night using my library book or using MyOn.
- ◆ Complete my written response activities based on reading selections.
