## Building Partnerships

Beulah Elementary School provides many opportunities that parents can utilize to help their children succeed. The **Parent Resource Center** (PRC) offers a variety of resources such as educational games, books, workbooks and other materials. Parents may use materials in the center, or they may take advantage of the lending library which is available at the center. The lending library provides parents with an opportunity to check-out resources for home use. There are also parent workshops and meetings scheduled throughout the year. ## Communication about Student Learning

# Our Goals for Student Achievement

## Douglas County School System Goals

The percentage of students scoring at Developing Learner or above on the Georgia Milestones (GMAS) English Language Arts End of Grade Assessments will increase by five percentage points.

# TEACHERS, PARENTS, STUDENTS TOGETHER FOR SUCCESS

## IN OUR KINDERGARTEN CLASSROOM

The Kindergarten teachers will work with students and their families to support student success in reading (sight words) and math. We will work with students and families in the following ways:

- ◆ Send home a sight word ring/list for at-home review, also grade level non-fiction & fiction books to reinforce reading fluency.
- ◆ Share with parents the use of educational websites to reinforce their child's skills. (MyOn, Starfall, ABC Mouse, Odyssey, Starfall Razz Kids and [www.engageny.org](http://www.engageny.org))
- ◆ Share with parents ways to incorporate counting, math shapes which we are covering in class, with our daily routine and in the real world that includes number recognition, missing numbers and quantity discrimination.
- ◆ Offer "Family Nights" throughout the year that focus on essential skills and strategies.

## AT HOME

Beulah Elementary School parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in reading and math. Some of our key at-home activities will be:

- ◆ Support and assist my child with homework, review sight words and daily reading to reinforce reading fluency and word/vocabulary recognition.
- ◆ Use logins provided by teacher to access education websites to review and develop mastery of objectives.
- ◆ Practice counting and recognizing numbers, use basic addition and subtraction in real-world situations (cooking, making lists, shopping, etc.), also point out shapes and have my child name them.
- ◆ Try to attend "Family Nights" or get information from the Instructional Lead Teacher or my child's teacher if we can't attend.

## BEULAH ELEMENTARY SCHOOL STUDENTS

Beulah Elementary School students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school and reach for the stars in reading and math. Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school:

- ◆ Complete homework (it is practice for what was taught in class) and review sight words daily.
- ◆ Use various educational websites to review and practice skills.
- ◆ Practice counting and math facts/problems at home with parents.
- ◆ Attend "Family Nights" with my family to learn more about how to improve at school.
