History

Douglas County High School was the first high school in

almost 40 years it was the only high school in Douglas

Douglasville.

Douglas County High School's International
Baccalaureate program is an internationally
recognized, rigorous, pre-university liberal arts course
of study that meets the needs of highly motivated and
academically oriented secondary students. Beyond
intellectual rigor and high academic standards, strong
emphasis is placed on the ideals of international
understanding and responsible citizenship. Douglas
County High School's IB Program started in 2006. It is
one of the 27 diploma programs in the state of GA.
Students from all 8 Douglas County middle schools are
eligible for acceptance into the IB program.
