Building Partnerships

Eastside Elementary School provides many opportunities that parents can utilize to help their children succeed. The Parent Resource Center (PRC) offers a variety of resources such as educational games, books, workbooks and other materials. Parents may use materials in the center, or they may take advantage of the lending library to check-out resources for home use. There are also parent workshops and meetings scheduled throughout the year that include topics such as STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) Homework Help and Test Taking Strategies. The Bearfoot Press and the Parent Post are two newsletters that are sent home that include more information on family engagement activities at our school.

Communication about Student Learning

Eastside Elementary School is committed to frequent two-way communication with families about children's learning. Some of the ways you can expect us to reach you include the following:

- Fourth grade teachers will utilize agendas as a daily communication tool.
- Parent-teacher conferences will be held twice per school year.
- Progress reports and report cards will be issued quarterly.
- Updates will be posted on the school and district websites.
- ParentLink and NotifyMe are also used.

Eastside Elementary School parents, students, staff, and teachers contributed to the development of this Compact. Teachers suggested home learning strategies, parents added ideas to make them more specific, and students told us what would help them. Our Goals for Student Achievement

Douglas County School System-Title I

The percentage of students scoring at Developing Learner or above on the Georgia Milestones (GMAS) English Language Arts End of Grade Assessments will increase by five percentage points.

Eastside Elementary School Goals

Math: 76% of 3rd - 5th grade students will score at Developing Learner or above on the Georgia Milestone Assessment for the 2017-2018 school year.

Reading: 73% of 3rd - 5th grade students will score at Developing Learner or above on the Georgia Milestone Assessment for the 2017-2018 school year.

TEACHERS, PARENTS, STUDENTS TOGETHER FOR SUCCESS

IN OUR FOURTH GRADE CLASSROOM

The Fourth Grade teachers will work with students and their families to support student success in reading and Eureka math. We will work with students and families in the following ways:

- ◆ Provide parents with free internet based resources for math and reading concepts (such as: learnzillion.com, mobymax.com, MyOn, ILearn, Zearn. Org and ten marks)
- ◆ Parents will be provided with math notes on mathematical concepts to use at home to complete monthly math problems.
- ◆ Parents will be provided with a description of reading skills that will be covered throughout the year. A graphic organizer will be used to help sharpen students' skills as they read informational text at home.
- ◆ Provide parents with module letters that children & their parents can work on together, utilizing child's class notes.

AT HOME

Eastside Elementary School parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in all content areas.

Some of our key at-home activities will be:

- ◆ Utilize teacher provided free websites, with my child, to reinforce math and reading concepts, but do not provide a lot of assistance.
- ◆ Use math notes to complete monthly math problems with my child.
- ◆ Use reading skills and graphic organizers to improve informational text comprehension.
- ◆ Work together with my child on teacher-provided module letters. I will assist my child in using their class notes to complete the assignments.
- ◆ Complete homework and review concepts and strategies.

EASTSIDE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL STUDENTS

Eastside Elementary School students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school and reach for the stars in reading, and math. Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school:

- ◆ Work on teacher provided websites with my family.
- ◆ Use math notes to complete monthly math problems.
- ◆ Read informational text at home and complete graphic organizer with my family.
