What is Title I?

Eastside Elementary is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support state and local school reform efforts tied to challenging state academic standards in order to reinforce and enhance efforts to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family involvement. All Title I schools must involve families in the written parent and family engagement policy.

School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it? This is a plan that describes how Eastside Elementary will provide opportunities to improve parent engagement to support student learning. Eastside Elementary values the contributions and involvement of parents in order to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. Who is it for? All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families, are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Eastside Elementary will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents with limited English, parents with disabilities and parents of migratory children.

Where is it available? At the beginning of the year, the plan is included in a packet of information that is sent home with all students. As a reminder, we will distribute the plan to all parents in August at the Annual Title I Parent Meeting. Parents can also obtain a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center and on the Eastside Elementary school website.

The percentage of students scoring at Developing Learner or above on the Georgia Milestones (GMAS) English Language Arts End of Grade Assessments will increase by five percentage points.

2017-2018 Eastside Elementary School Goals

Math: 76% of 3rd - 5th grade students will score at Developing Learner or above on the Georgia Milestone Assessment for the 2017-2018 school year.

Reading: 73% of 3rd - 5th grade students will score at Developing Learner or above on the Georgia Milestone Assessment for the 2017-2018 school year.
