type="checkbox"/> <u>Make</u> a prediction from pictures and titles <input type="checkbox"/> <u>Recognize</u> that stories can have multiple speakers <p>Compares and contrasts text genres</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> <u>Recognize</u> the basic elements of a variety of genres (e.g., poetry, fables, folktales) <input type="checkbox"/> <u>Tell</u> which books are stories and which tells true things <input type="checkbox"/> <u>Recognize</u> plot, setting, and characters within a text <input type="checkbox"/> <u>Use</u> graphic organizers to compares how characters are alike and different <p style="text-align: center;">Reading Informational Skills</p> <p>Explains similarities and differences between individuals, events, ideas, or information in a (text-text) <input type="checkbox"/> <u>Make</u> connections (text-self) <input type="checkbox"/> <u>Use</u> a graphic organizer to compare how two texts are the same or different <p>Identify text <u>Write</u> an opinion statement <input type="checkbox"/> <u>Add</u> details to an opinion statement <input type="checkbox"/> <u>Write</u> connections (text-text, text-self, and text-world) as appropriate <input type="checkbox"/> <u>Organize</u> writing to include a beginning, middle, and end, including a clear conclusion <p>Composes informational/ explanatory text that includes an organizational structure, facts and details, and a conclusion</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> <u>Write</u> a beginning to capture the reader's interest <input type="checkbox"/> <u>Add</u> details <input type="checkbox"/> <u>Provide</u> some sense of closure <input type="checkbox"/> <u>Understand</u> and <u>use</u> step by step organizational structures: <input type="checkbox"/> <u>Focus</u> on one topic <p>Composes narrative text that includes details & a clear sequence of events</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> <u>Organize</u> writing to include a beginning, middle, and end <input type="checkbox"/> <u>Write</u> about a personal experience or imaginary story in writing <input type="checkbox"/> <u>Develop</u> characters and setting <input type="checkbox"/> <u>Adds</u> details to expand a story <input type="checkbox"/> <u>Write</u> text of appropriate length to address topic <p>Conducts short research and
