Whether you plan to continue your education through medical school or want to graduate from high school into a health science career, the health science pathways provide academic courses, relevant on-the-job experience, and specialized technical skills needed for the workforce. Special emphasis is also placed on developing problem-solving and decision-making skills that are required in the fast-paced health science industry

The career and educational opportunities available in health science are varied and virtually unlimited, as are the postsecondary educational opportunities. Graduates can transition into high-demand entry level health science careers and/or continue their education at the postsecondary institution of their choice.
