II. Facility/Safety Reports

Erik Cioffi

- a. Agricultural and Environmental Science Facility—mfg came in at over 5 million; reviewing facility and eliminating unnecessary items – granite countertops, etc. There will be a new maximum guaranteed price hopefully in February.
- b. Sound System New Gymnasium—being installed—cost over \$25,000 which had to be approved by BOE. Will make gym usable for graduation and other events.
- c. Salto locks being installed—currently being installed. Will take a couple of weeks for remaining equipment and then slide cards and software will be operational (select doors right now and additional doors hopefully next year).
- d. Field turf – completed as of Monday (Jan 16). Was six months from warranty expiring so we were able to save district large sum of money. New field is Good for eight years.

III. Discipline Report

Scott Ramsey

Aug 4 – Dec 21 there were 327 discipline referrals; 222 referrals by teachers with remainder by admin and bus drivers; Dr. Ramsey expressed how very fortunate FCHS is to have such low numbers of discipline referrals. He also credited the low number of referrals to good students, supportive parents, consistency among staff in enforcing expectations and consistency in admin for how referrals are handled.
