IV. Curriculum/CTAE

- a. Presented to BOE
 - i. Business Pathway—shared numbers and conversations related to the local board computer requirement and the pathways associated with the course. The BOE has to table the motion for a month and then vote in May. Members liked the idea of still offering the course even though it would not be required.
 - ii. Intro to Digital Tech—surveyed current 8th graders (incoming 9th graders) and 36 of the students indicated they would still want to take the course even if it no longer is a required course. We have 18 upperclassmen signed up for course so we will offer two sections of the course next year (pending BOE vote in May).
 - iii. Graduation Requirement—Pending BOE approval, the computer course will no longer be a requirement for graduation from FCHS—starting with the freshmen entering in the fall of 2017. It remains a requirement for all students who entered 9th grade prior to the fall of 2017.

- b. Capstone Project—Currently we have 91 Seniors who have completed the Project; it consists of four parts—the portfolio; research paper; research paper presentation; and 8 hours of mentoring (we allow students to count two hours from their four years of attending career day presentations so they actually need 6 on-site hours of mentoring)
 - i. April 19th – Job Shadow—for seniors to obtain mentor hours
 - ii. Portfolio – Research Paper - Presentation

V. School News

- a. Video – produced by Cooper Earls

Principals present to the BOE twice a year. This time Mr. Cioffi opted to show student video to BOE about “high school life.” School is more than data and test results. This video is a good way to remember there are faces behind all of the data.

- b. ETC Ignite Grant - \$21,000

Mrs. Burch and her FCCLA students designed a plan for a hydroponic garden; Mr. Gibbs and his TSA students designed a tv recording and producing studio. Both groups won \$10,000 along with \$500 for being a finalist. We are very proud of our students and sponsors and look forward to their programs being fully implemented.

VI. Good of the Order

PBIS minutes presented by Holly Viccaro. PBIS members will be sharing data with teachers on a regular basis. For example, the average number of discipline referrals at FCHS per day is 1.6 (which is a complement to students and staff). PBIS continues to recognize students and staff. Have implemented an attendance competition among the four classes with a reward for class with best attendance at the end of the month.

Security Update—Teachers have a personal “key badge” and one classroom badge for students to use when going between buildings. The hope is to add additional locks on more doors soon.
