

WORK-BASED LEARNING PROGRAM

Work-Based Learning programs are structured experiences that connect the student's career goal and classroom learning with a productive work environment. Students participating in the Work-Based Learning Program have opportunities to link what they learn in school with worksite application, enabling a smooth transition into the work force and/or education beyond high school.

Students in Work-Based learning are classified in one of four ways according to the alignment of their career-tech coursework with job placement and future postsecondary/career plans:

- Youth Apprenticeship (YAP)
- Internship
- Cooperative Education
- Employability Skills development

Student placement is dependent on defined criteria for each placement type including the paid or unpaid status.

Eligibility

All 11th and 12th grade students on track for graduation, are a minimum of 16 years of age and meet the program requirements may enroll in the Work-Based Learning Program.

Requirements for Admission

- A defined career goal
- Enrollment in or completion of a pathway
- Good attendance and discipline record
- Recommendations from other teachers
- Reliable transportation and proof of insurance
