

FCMS PBIS (Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports)

FCMS PBIS Information:

Fannin County Middle School wants to provide a safe and positive learning environment for students, teachers and staff through the implementation of Positive Behavior Interventions & Supports (PBIS) System. In addition, we want to reduce behavior problems that interfere with student learning. PBIS is a school-wide system that will help improve consistency in expected behaviors, resulting in students being ready and prepared to learn.

What is PBIS? School-wide Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports is a systems approach to establishing the social culture and behavioral supports needed for all children in a school to achieve both social and academic success.

Behavior Expectations-

“SHOW FCMS REBEL PRIDE”

Be Respectful : Recognizing the worth and importance of self and others

Be Responsible : Being dependable, trustworthy, and taking ownership for one’s actions

Be Safe : Doing things that are physically and emotionally safe for self and others

How will PBIS be implemented at FCMS ?

Behaviors will be taught just like academic skills are taught. Our focus is to build a positive environment in our schools and classrooms. By teaching these core behavior expectations, FCMS strives to equip all students with the knowledge necessary to achieve their unique potential.

What happens when my child displays expected behaviors?

Any administrator, teacher, or staff member can reward students who display expected behaviors. Rebel passes are earned by the students for meeting school-wide expectations.

Recognition: Various opportunities are available daily, weekly, monthly, and every nine weeks. We welcome our REBEL PASSES back this school year. Rebel Passes may have a variety of uses, based on grade levels. School- wide uses are: names entered for drawing of prizes (for example): free passes to school events (ballgames, etc), Walmart gift cards, Rebel Pride T-shirts, and other various prizes. Rebel Passes may also be used once a month for different events : “Rebel Pride Pass Pride Day” : 5 passes for one snow cone, 2 passes for a bag of popcorn, after

lunch, hat day-2 passes to wear a hat, to exchange for additional popcorn/ snow cone at Reward Day, each nine weeks. Reward Day will take place at the end of each nine weeks. Please refer to the tracking form in your child's agenda. Students that have zero loss of points, on the tracking form, will have their names entered for a chance to win a Walmart gift card.
