# a word or phrase that reads the same forwards and backwards

My <u>mom</u> drives her car like it's a <u>racecar</u> and will <u>toot</u> the horn to make people move.

# **Metaphor** comparing two unlike things by saying that one is the other

#### The homework was a breeze.

# Our cats <u>meow</u> when they are hungry and want to be fed.

### OXYMOTON a short phrase that combines two normally contradictory terms

### "That building is a <u>little bit big</u> and <u>pretty ugly</u>."

# pun

### using similar sounding words or phrases, usually in an attempt be funny

Pencils could be made with erasers at both ends, but what would be the point?

- Kap'n Klystron

### SIMIC comparing two unlike things by using the words *like* or *as*

The clouds looked like cotton candy.

# **Dersonification** giving human qualities, feelings, action, or characteristics to inanimate (non-living) objects

The teddy bear sat slumped on the bed, looking <u>sadly</u> at its feet.

# hyberbole using exaggeration for emphasis or effect

#### The books weighed a ton.

# **imagery**

### using the senses of sight, touch, sound, smell and taste to create vivid pictures

**Sight:** "magnified apples appear and disappear...every fleck of russet showing clear"

**Smell:** "Essence of winter sleep in on the night, the scent of apples"
