Students must have a 3.0 average in all academic courses:

Language Arts

Math

Social Studies

Science

Modern/Classical Language



ZELL MILLER SCHOLARSHIP

Students must have a 3.7 average in all academic courses:

Language Arts, Math, Social Studies, Science, and Modern/Classical Language



Students must have a score of 1200 or higher on math and verbal portions of the SAT or a 26 or higher on the ACT (in one testing)

- * Advanced Placement classes are weighted, meaning 10 points are added to the final grade. These points are subtracted, the grade is converted to the 4.0 scale and .5 is added to that class' GPA up to a total of 4.0 per class grade.
- * The Hope scholarship GPA is not determined by the local high school. Hope GPA is determined by the Georgia Student Finance Commission.

Examples for figuring the Grade Point Average for an Advanced Placement class:

* Final grade of
$$95 - 10 = 85$$

 $85 = 3.0 + .5 = 3.5$

* Final grade of
$$85 - 10 = 75$$

 $75 = 2.0 + .5 = 2.5$

* Final grade of
$$75 - 10 = 65$$

 $65 = 0.0 + .5 = .5$

- * Public Colleges in Georgia pays a portion of tuition.
- * Technical Colleges in Georgia pays tuition for certificate and diploma programs regardless of GPA through the HOPE Grant (see next slide); however, one must meet the GPA requirements for a degree program.
- **Private Colleges in Georgia** pays \$3500 per year towards tuition.

HOPE GRANT

- · High school graduate in Georgia
