The University of Georgia Terry College of Business is offering two programs:

1: Terry Accounting Residency Program is open to rising juniors and seniors in high school and freshmen entering UGA. Learn about the accounting profession and get a taste of campus life at UGA. What's included:

- Instructional sessions during the day and fun activities at night
- Hear about career options from some of the state's top accounting firms, business groups, and government agencies
- Learn about business etiquette and how to write a resume
- Develop your financial literacy and leadership skills

Summer program is June 17 – 20 or July 8-11, 2012 Application deadline is March 30, 2012.

2: Terry Business Academy is a selective, pre-collegiate summer program at the University of Georgia College of Business. If you are a rising junior or senior in high school with an interest in business and entrepreneurship, this intensive one-week program will expose you to many aspects of business that you can experience in an exciting environment with students who share your curiosity and drive. What's included:

- College level academic activities
- Game night, cookouts, and a class-organized social
- Site visits to corporate headquarters and innovative companies
- Exploration of business majors and potential career paths
- Focused instruction on presentations skills and marketing plans
- Golf lessons at the top-rated UGA golf course
- In the midst of UGA's picturesque campus and the vibrancy of downtown Athens. The summer program is June 3 - 9 or June 24 - 30. Application deadline is March 30, 2012.

Converse Campus in Spartanburg, South Carolina offers several summer workshops. Some are:

- **CSI Converse:** a workshop for exploring the world of forensic science by securing a crime scene, gathering clues and processing evidence in science labs. Students will consider real cases and then work with Converse faculty to analyze similar evidence from fictional cases. You will hear from forensics experts and spend an afternoon touring the Spartanburg Crime Lab. Workshop size is limited to ensure individual attention. It will be a week that develops analytical thinking and problem-solving skills in the context of intriguing and sometimes surprising evidence.
- **Young Writers Workshop** – a community of intellectually curious and motivated writers working to develop talents in poetry, fiction, playwriting and creative nonfiction. Workshop participants will learn from professional writers through daily critique sessions, writing workshops, craft discussions, panels and readings. The hand-on approach will include personal instruction to help writers recognize their strengths, potential, and avenues for successful writing, editing and publishing. Students will also give a public reading of their work on the final day.

Emma Bowen Foundation for Minority Interests in Media Internship Program

In 1989, community and social activists Emma L. Bowen and Dr. Everett C. Parker launched The Foundation for Minority Interests in Media with the help of the very companies they hoped to serve. The Foundation’s mission is to

prepare minority youth for a broad spectrum of careers in media and provide the industry with a diverse, well-trained talent pool. Unlike traditional internships, students work for partner companies during summers and school breaks for four consecutive years. During this four-year program, students have an opportunity to learn many aspects of corporate operations and develop company-specific skills. This unique multi-year program prepares a diverse group of talented young professionals to enter the workforce with specific job-related skills, knowledge of the corporate environment, and a strong foundation for future advancement.

Emma L. Bowen Foundation Criteria

Eligibility for an internship/scholarship is based upon a student who:

- is a minority student with an interest in the media industry (business, technical, creative, or journalism)
- has a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or better and plans to attend a four-year college or university on a full-time basis.
- has submitted an application (available at: www.emmabowenfoundation.com)
- and is ultimately selected for the program by one of the Foundation's corporate sponsors.

Award: Students earn an hourly salary for hours worked each summer as well as matching scholarship funds to use toward educational expenses.

Additional Programs: In addition to the work/study program, Foundation students are invited to attend an annual summer conference in New York City to learn about industry issues and trends and meet industry leaders. A formal mentoring program, iLink, is also sponsored by the Foundation to provide students with industry mentors.

The Foundation has also established a New Media and Technology program for students studying engineering and information systems. Students interested in internships focused on technology in the media industry should check the appropriate box on page 1 of the application.
