- Being sure our children read at home and talk with them about what they are reading
- Having our children write about their experiences so they have more practice writing
- Keeping the lines of communication open with your students and the teachers
- Provide basic school supplies for the student.
- Assist with completing any homework or check to see if student has homework.
- Make sure student is present at school everyday and is on time.

Students:

Students helped identify practices they can use to help them attain the goals of the school.

- Study for tests and quizzes
- Ask myself questions as I read and read a story again if I don't understand
- Use Thinking Maps as I organize my writing in my classes
- Use reading and writing strategies that are taught in Educational Enrichment to help me read on a higher level and be able to write an organized grammatically correct paragraph
- Attempt all assignments to the best of my ability given by the teacher and ask for help if needed
