- *Increase the value of the district College and Career Readiness Performance Index (CCRPI) score by ensuring each Houston County School provides high quality instruction aligned with state standards with a focus on literacy, standards-based instruction and Response to Intervention (RTI)*
- *Increase the percentage of parents who feel their child's school provides various opportunities for engagement*

School Goals

We will increase the value of the CCRPI score from a baseline of 72.6 to 73.4.

We will increase the percentage of graduation in the four-year cohort from a baseline of 82.4 to 82.9.

- * *Host Freshman Parent Information Night and provide parents with a copy of the 9th Grade Guide to Northside High School*
- * *Train parents on the use of Infinite Campus to monitor grades and attendance*
- * *Host a Pre-Advisement Night for Rising 9th Graders to present academic and career tech choices available to students for the 2018-2019 school year. Parents will learn about dual enrollment, AP classes, Credit Recovery, and Career Pathways.*
- * *Invite parents to attend Evening Advisement where we will review graduation requirements, review their child's graduation plan, and speak with them about CCRPI scoring.*
- * *Host S.T.E.M Night where parents will have an opportunity to work with their child on science, technology, math, and engineering topics currently being taught in class.*
- * *Host Social Studies/Literature Night where parents will have an opportunity to experience the standards, events, and topics currently being taught in their student's classes.*

Students Will:

Read and implement the strategies in the 9th grade guide to Northside High

Keep up with their grades by checking Infinite Campus frequently

Attend Pre-Advisement/College Fair Night and Evening Advisement in order to make informed decisions about class schedules as well as graduation and post-secondary education and workforce opportunities.

Participate in S.T.E.M. and SS/Lit event activities

Families Will:

Attend Freshman Parent Information Night and take advantage of the opportunity to set a conference with their child's teacher. They will read and discuss the 9th Grade Guide to Northside High with their child to ensure that they understand the guidelines & strategies they will need to stay on track for graduation.

Utilize Infinite Campus to monitor their student's progress, grades, and attendance on a regular basis.

Attend Pre- Advisement/College Fair night to learn about the different educational opportunities and programs being offered at Northside.

Attend Evening Advisement to assist their child in class selections, review graduation requirements, and ensure that their child is on track to graduate on time.

Actively participate in S.T.E.M. Night so that they can work hands on with their child and gain a better understanding of how their classwork incorporates science, technology, math, and engineering.

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
