A Brief History

The Peach County Retired Educators Association came into being as a result of a clear vision of the way to get a group of retired teachers to work together for the good of all. Mrs. Mamie J. Miller, after joining a retired teachers group in Warner Robins, Georgia was encouraged by some local teacher retirees to organize an association for Peach County. This she did, with the help of a state officer and some interested Fort Valley, Georgia retired teachers. Thus, on March 6, 1976, the Peach County Retired Educators Association was formed.

After writing a constitution and a set of bylaws which followed the guidelines of the Georgia Retired Teachers Association, the Peach County Unit was granted a charter. The association operated progressively since the beginning.
