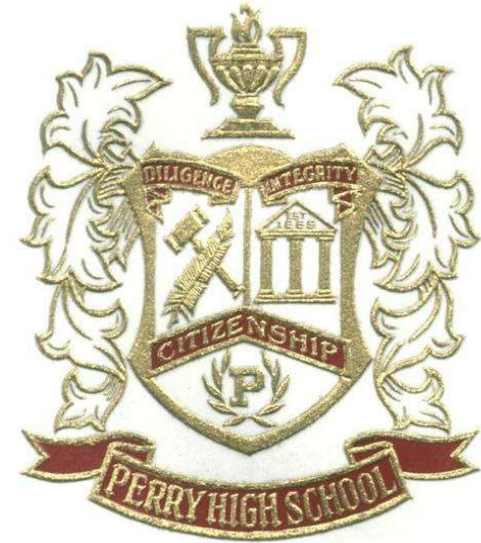

Our Goals for Student Achievement

District Goals

- Increase the value of the district College and Career Ready Performance Index (CCRPI) score by 3% by focusing on high quality standards-based instruction, literacy and Multi-Tiered Systems of Support.

- Train parents to effectively use the features of Infinite Campus to monitor grades and attendance.

Family Responsibilities:

- Attend academic events- specifically *Putting the Pieces Together* to learn strategies to support student growth in reading, vocabulary and processing skills. Also, to learn more about Credit Recovery and its impact on course completion and graduation.
- Read the academic newsletters and utilize specific information provided.
- Schedule and attend appointment for Evening Advisement to review graduation requirements and post-secondary opportunities.
- Sign up for Infinite Campus Training to learn program features to monitor student's grades and attendance effectively.

Student Responsibilities:

- Discuss and apply strategies learned to complete daily warm ups for reading, vocabulary and processing. Work diligently to complete modules required to graduate on time, if enrolled in Credit Recovery.
- Read and discuss Academic Newsletter with parents.
- Attend Evening Advisement to review graduation requirements and post-secondary opportunities.
- Monitor grades by checking Infinite Campus on a regular basis.
