- Provide math homework assignments that will allow parent participation and feedback
- Provide training for websites that will support math instruction
- Provide study guides for each nine week exam in Math and English Language Arts
- Give parents a specific set of annotations to use as students read to promote literacy
- Provide a reading log to encourage students to read twenty minutes per night to promote reading comprehension
- Provide Infinite Campus and Office 365 Training
- Post Class Work and Assignments daily to "Padlet"

Students will...

- Complete math homework to the best of my ability. I will then discuss the homework with my parent and have them initial that we have reviewed the assignment.
- Encourage my parent to attend the math content parent focused events
- Complete nine week exams study guides and have my parent initial that I have put forth my best effort
- Use schoolwide annotations in my reading
- Read twenty minutes each night and have parents verify by initialing Reading Log
- Use Infinite Campus to monitor grades.
- Access Daily "Padlet" Post for review and homework help

Families will...

- Review students math homework and provide feedback to the teachers on problems that students were not able to solve
- Attend math content parent nights to gain an understanding of the websites that support math instruction
- Ensure that my child has completed nine weeks study guides to the best of their ability by initialing the study guide and providing any necessary feedback to the teacher
- Ensure that my child is using annotations as they read at home
- Sign Reading Log to verify that my child has read for twenty minutes each night
- Attend Infinite Campus and Office 365 Training
- Use Infinite Campus to monitor grades
- Review "Padlet" Post Daily
