# High School Graduation Requirements

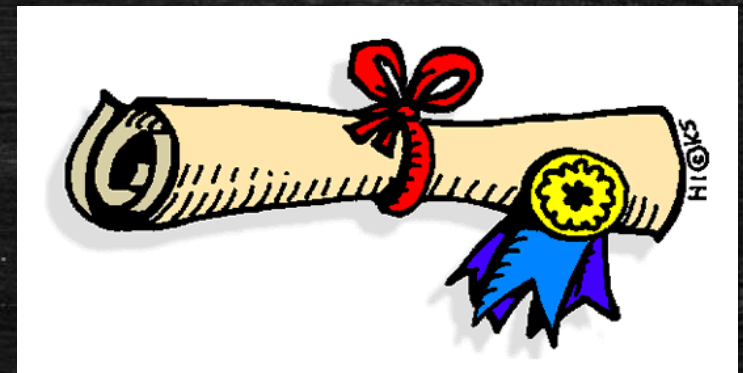
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- 4 Math Credits (Algebra 1, Geometry, Algebra 2, 4<sup>th</sup> level)
- 4 English Credits (must include 9<sup>th</sup> Lit & Amer. Lit)
- 4 Science Credits (must include Biology, Physical Science or Physics & Chemistry or Environmental Science)
- 3 Social Studies Credits (must be Civics, Economics, World History & US History)
- Personal Fitness & Health
- 3 Elective Credits from Fine Arts, Foreign Language and/or CTAE
- 5 additional elective credits from any category

# Using D.E. to Meet Your Graduation Requirements

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- It allows students to earn high school credits while taking college courses and earning college credit as well.
- D.E. is available to any student in grades 9-12 th.



# Dual Enrollment FACTS

- Provides Financial Assistance for post-secondary tuition.
- Students can go part time (high school classes & college classes) or full time (all classes at the college)
- Each D.E. course blocks 2 periods from your schedule; due to travel time.
- Students must select their courses from the approved D.E. course directory (found at the [GAFutures.org](http://GAFutures.org) website)
- Courses taken do not count against your HOPE financial aid cap
- College level work is expected, supervised, and administered by the college; not the High School.
- \*\*\*If you withdraw from a course after VHS 10 day class change window, you will receive a 69% for that class.

# Step 1: How to Apply for D.E.

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- If interested in D.E., you and your parent(s) should review this PowerPoint and research which school you would like to attend.
- You will then need to apply to take the SAT ([www.collegeboard.org](http://www.collegeboard.org)) or ACT ([www.actstudent.org](http://www.actstudent.org)) or the college-specific entrance exam (Accuplacer)
- Apply at a participating eligible post-secondary institution (must meet the institution's GPA/admission requirements)



## Step 2: How to Apply for D.E. cont.

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- Once Accepted...
- Make sure D.E. Checklist (Signed)
- \*\*Must follow dates/deadlines carefully
- \*Must see Counselor before registering for classes\*
- Summer 2018 Deadline- May 31<sup>st</sup>
- Fall 2018 Deadline- May 31<sup>st</sup>
- Spring 2019 Deadline- December 13<sup>th</sup>



# Step 3: How to Apply for D.E. cont.

Once you have been accepted into a college and reviewed checklist with parent signatures...

- Please Sign up in Counselors' Suite:

List Name, School, check mark what documents you have.

- Counselor will then call you to discuss & complete the DE Student Participation Agreement Form (Return Signed)
- Must have copy of Participation Agreement Form signed by parents/counselor before registering for classes.



# Step 4: How to Apply for D.E. cont.

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- Complete your DE Online Application at [GAFutures.org](http://GAFutures.org)
- \*\*Must complete this portion or you may be sent a bill to pay for your tuition.
- Once you have registered for classes at the college you must set up an appointment w/ your counselor for high school schedule adjustments.  
(\*Schedule is required)


