For a complete description and details concerning the Move on When Ready program, go to GACollege411.org. Eligible students who choose to enroll in MOWR must complete the steps below and submit this completed checklist to their counselor not later than May 31, 2016.

Student responsibilities:

1. _____ Apply for admission to the college in which you wish to enroll. Pay application fee (if applicable)
2. _____ Meet all admissions requirements of the college by taking/submitting any applicable assessments such as the ACT, SAT, Compass, or college specific entrance exam.

3. _____ Have your high school transcript sent to the college in which you wish to enroll.
4. _____ After you are accepted to the college of your choice, complete the on-line MOWR application each term at www.gacollege411.org.
5. _____ Bring documentation of your college acceptance and this completed checklist to your counselor no later than deadlines provided below based on term attending MOWR.

Once all items above are complete, an appointment with the student/parent will be scheduled with the counselor prior to the start of summer 2016 or the 2016-2017 school year. Specific college course enrollment and high school scheduling will be finalized. Parents will complete final MOWR paperwork signing off on each college course requested.

High School Deadlines:

Summer 2016-

- Monday, April 4th: Proof of acceptance from the college (Students complete check list items to get to this point)
- Monday, May 16th - Friday, May 20th: Students schedule conferences with school counselor
 - Student brings college class schedule, which is needed to finalize school-level schedule.
 - Student receives MOWR Participation Agreement to complete and return by Monday, May 23rd.

Fall 2016-

- Week of May 31st: Proof of acceptance from the college (Students complete check list items to get to this point)
- Monday, July 18th - Friday, July 22nd: Students schedule conferences with school counselor

- Student brings college class schedule, which is needed to finalize school-level schedule.
- Student receives MOWR Participation Agreement to complete and return by Friday, August 5th.
- Counselor and student plan for full year scheduling, making a year commitment and plan.

Spring 2017 –

- Dec 1st – 7th: Students schedule conferences with school counselor (*Current and new MOWR students must complete this step)
 - Proof of acceptance from the college (Students complete check list items to get to this point)
 - Student brings college class schedule, which is needed to finalize school-level schedule.
 - Student receives MOWR Participation Agreement to complete and return by Friday, January 6.

Things to consider:

- For every college class a student takes, he/she will be released for two periods of the high school schedule.
- The high school does not have any control over college course offerings, availability or times.
- The high school does not provide transportation, materials, or academic assistance for courses taken at college.
- MOWR is a yearlong commitment unless student does not meet Satisfactory Academic Progress requirements. Students attending college classes during specific periods of the school day 1st semester will be expected to continue to take classes during those periods 2nd semester.
- Each college class counts for 1.0 unit of credit on the high school transcript.
- Participation in MOWR is subject to deadlines imposed by participating colleges and the High School.
- If a course at the high school requires students to take an End of Course Test, MOWR students will take the same EOC. (i.e. Economics)
- If student withdrawals from college without completing the course they cannot return to the high school that semester. This could jeopardize graduation and the ability to remain in the MOWR program.
- Colleges have attendance policies that students must adhere to that are different from the high school.
- The high school counselor advises on college courses needed to complete high school graduation requirements, not requirements for college degree student is seeking.
