6. Copy of official notice of unconditional acceptance to a regionally accredited college or university OR letter of acceptance from a US military branch

Scholarship decisions will be made by April 1, 2019, and recipients will be notified shortly thereafter. The scholarship recipients will be expected to attend a Youth Recognition Breakfast on Saturday, April 23, 2019, at 9:00 am.
