<u>SYLLABUS</u> THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

Course: 12th Grade Composition Teacher: D.Dillard Term: Fall 2013

Description of course/major objectives: This course will present a study of various modes, styles, and purposes of writing, with an emphasis on literary criticism. It will also explore the basics of writing a research paper. Grammar and mechanics will be a main focus as well.

Specific Class Rules/Policies:

- 1. All students are responsible for reading and abiding by the classroom rules posted in the front of the room.
- 2. School tardy policies will be enforced.
- 3. Gum chewing is frowned upon, and there will be no eating or drinking in the classroom.

Students should be prepared to call on prior knowledge of stories, poems, novels, etc. and be ready to form new ideas from newly introduced pieces. Short compositions will accompany the longer analysis papers, and students should be committed to SUPPORTING their own ideas with evidence from literary sources and critics. PLAGIARISM WILL NOT BE TOLERATED AND WILL RESULT IN A FAILING GRADE FOR THE ASSIGNMENT.
