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



What is Literacy?

Literacy is defined as the ability to read and write. However, there are different levels of literacy, from Level 1 to Level 5.


Level 1- Can read a little, but not well enough to fill out an application, or read a simple story to a child.

Level 2- Can perform more complex tasks such as comparing, contrasting, or integrating pieces of information.

Levels 3 through 5- can perform the same types of more complex tasks on increasingly lengthy and dense tests and documents.

Importance of Adult Literacy

In a study conducted by the National Adult Literacy Service, approximately 44 million people scored at Level 1. Another 50 million people scored at Level 2. Literacy experts believe that adults with reading skills at Levels 1 and 2 lack a sufficient foundation to function successfully in today's society.




Is Literacy Really A Problem?

About 785 million people are illiterate.

1 out of 5 adults (20%) do not know how to write or read.

Adults at the lowest level of illiteracy are almost 10 times more likely to live below the poverty line (41-44% compared to 4-8%).

1 in 4 children in America grow up without learning how to read.
