## Nurse's Corner

Below you will find important information regarding physicals and sport physicals for the upcoming school year.
Students entering 6th grade must have a new physical on file in the nurse's office in order to come to school. We have a first day exclusion policy which means your student cannot come to school on the first day if they do not have a completed physical. The sixth grade physical is good for the sports physical if the doctor marks "yes" to the two areas on the physical that says physical education and interscholastic sports. It is good for one year from the date on the exam. If you wish the student to participate in sports throughout the entire school year, get the physical sometime between June and August.

Students entering 7th and 8th grade-A reminder to parents about sport physicals-Sportlink will be coming to Simmons on August 18, 2011 from 11:30 am to 1:30 pm. Students who wish to play sports must have a current sport physical. (A sport physical is good for one year from the date your student was seen by the doctor). Registration is online-you must pre-register your student. This year Sportlink will be accepting insurance!!! I hope this helps save you time and money. Staff, which are associated with the Sportlink program are very professional and give a complete and thorough evaluation of your student's readiness to participate in our sport program. This physical is good for the entire year of sport activities.

Minute Clinics and Walgreens also do sport physicals. Locations are posted at our main office.
Sixth graders also need a dental exam to be completed by the end of sixth grade. Simmons offers Smile Illinois Mobile Dentists program every May. This year they are coming on May 12th. Forms were sent home and are available in the office.

## Physical Education

As the school year wraps up, all PE classes will be enjoying the weather outside as much as possible. Units students will be participating in include softball, kickball, soccer, flag football, ultimate frisbee, sand volleyball and more. At the end of the year, any eighth grader that does not want their uniform may donate it back to Simmons for a rental. Sixth and seventh graders will need to keep their lock and uniforms for next year. We hope you have a very safe and active summer.

## 6th Grade

Fourth quarter brings art class to the orange team! We have a lot of fun and educational projects planned for orange team art, and so far we have completed two projects and are already in construction with our third! We began the quarter learning about basic art elements line and value through an interesting line shading project. Our second project that is now on display in our display case was a perspective name drawing. Students were introduced to the challenging and advanced concept of perspective and drew their name using those principles. A self-portrait is currently in the works. We're off to a great start for fourth quarter! In math, we are exploring everything and anything you can do with integers-comparing, ordering, adding, subtracting, multiplying, and dividing. After that we will be trying our hand at some algebra and one step equations preparing for pre-algebra in 7th grade. Literature classes are discussing books in literature circles. The advanced class is reading Stargirl by Jerry Spinelli and the others are engrossed in Number
the Stars by Lois Lowry. The students are engaging in high level thinking skills within their groups of four. They have the independence to use appropriate strategies to understand what they read. Language Arts classes are busy finding information about the person they are researching for their biography project. We have our sources and now we are taking notes in preparation for writing about our person of interest. There is much work left to do since we have to type them and give a presentation to the rest of the class so everyone can learn. Science is proving to be very interesting so far! We will continue to complete our third book, Earth's Changing Surface. This book explores the topics of maps, soil conservation, and weathering. These topics fit in perfectly with Earth Day! After that, we will continue on to our final book of the school year, Weather and Climate. Our students are looking forward to being a "meteorologist" a day!

## 7th Grade

Seventh grade had a great end of third quarter! In Spanish, students are learning family member and adjective vocabulary. We are also working on adjective-noun agreement. To practice these skills, students made scrapbooks showcasing and describing their family.
In literature, the red team is reading Soldier's Heart, a novel of historical fiction by Gary Paulsen. The story is based on a real boy, Charley Goddard who fought in the Civil War. The book is about the terrors of war, in particular, the worst battles in history and their effects on a soldier. Charley wrote letters to his mother and the letters were used to create Gary Paulsen's story.
Have you ever wondered what it would be like to live in a utopian society? Advanced literature is finding out the answer to this
question by reading The Giver by Lois Lowry.

In math, we have just finished working with geometry and data. In language arts, seventh grade students are working on completing their research papers.

Students will be working on poetry soon, and continue their study of narrative writing. Also during the 7th grade trip to Springfield, students were able to see the offices of state officials they had learned about for the Constitution test. Our trip also included the Lincoln Museum, a perfect lead up to the Civil War which we will soon be covering!

In science, the students have just finished their roller coaster projects and have begun their sound and light unit. We will be looking at the nature of sound and light and how it affects our everyday lives. Students will
learn concepts like why we see certain colors or how our ears catch sound waves to communicate with our brains.


## 8th Grade



It is hard to believe we are coming up on the final weeks of the school year. Here are the interesting activities the students will be engaged in during their fourth and final quarter at Simmons.

In literature, students will be using reading strategies to analyze various literacy devices in The Outsiders by S.E. Hinton.

In language arts, students will be working in groups to debate a local issue to the Simmons school community. Following the end of our persuasive unit, students will analyze the meaning behind symbols and literary devices in some of their favorite movies.

Advanced literature students will use their expert literary skills to comprehend and make meaningful connections to Fallen Angels by Walter Dean Myers. This piece of fiction tells the story of an

American who is sent overseas to fight in the Vietnam War.
In math, students will be focusing on the real world uses of math skills like balancing a checkbook and using percents.

In science, we have just begun the fourth quarter book and are learning about the organization of the human body. Studying this material will be preparing the students for the upcoming rat dissection.
Currently, in social studies we are traveling through the WWII era. Students will be creating dioramas depicting scenes from WWII.

In Spanish, we will end the year speaking about clothing, accessories, and other items found in department stores. Students will use the preterite tense to talk about what happened in the past. Students will learn the names of different professions, hobbies, and sports.
