8th Grade

Greetings 8th Grade Parents and Students! Here's some news about current eighth grade endeavors:

•In literature classes, the students have been enjoying suspenseful short stories, such as *The Hitchhiker* and *The Tell-Tale Heart*. We will be ending the year by reading the novel, *The Outsiders*, written by S.E. Hinton. This book always turns out to be an 8th grade favorite.

•In language arts classes the students are continuing to expand their vocabularies with the study of morphemes, prefixes, suffixes, root words, and base words. They are also studying grammar through the use of the Write Source textbook, and working on other activities and projects to improve their speech presentation skills. Finally, the students are working on a poetry and a movie

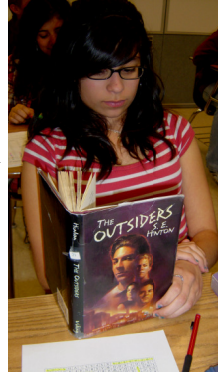
project.

•In math, the students are working with polynomials, tessellations, and real world math applications.

•In science classes, the students are studying the systems of the body in order to get ready for the culminating activity... The Rat Dissection, which will take place later in May.

•In social studies classes, the students are learning about World War II and The Cold War.

•In Spanish classes, the students are



learning about past-times and sports, and how to say they like something.

A reminder to parents that the eighth graders have received their end of the year contracts. Please stress the importance of grades, homework and tests with your child. Also, continue to discuss the importance of good, responsible behavior at school. Don't forget that the consequences for inappropriate behavior will result in the loss of the end of the year eighth grade activities. Let's make the rest of the year the best it can be for all of our students. Thank you for your continued support, as it is very important to us. There are only about 25 school days left until Graduation! Can you believe it?

7th Grade

The seventh grade students are down to the last six weeks of school! Where did the time go? The weather is getting warmer and the kids can't wait for Summer vacation, but that DOES NOT mean



no more homework! Continue to check the school website for the daily activities and assignments for each class. In social studies, Yellow Team has successfully completed the Federal and State Constitution Tests! Nice Job! We are finishing our "Oregon Trail" activity, and beginning to "Set the Stage" for the Civil War. In science, students are exploring the world of microbiology and plants through the "eyes

of their peers" as students take on the role of "expert in the field" and they build models, posters, bulletin boards, or activities. In Spanish, students are learning to use descriptive vocabulary in order to describe themselves, their friends, and other aspects of their lives. They are also learning how to talk about different activities in Spanish and what activities they enjoy. Students are also exploring the culture and traditions in the Dominican Republic. All language arts classes are working on their research papers. Red Team is focusing on Illinois related topics while Yellow Team is researching unsolved mysteries. All literature classes are reading novels

during 4th quarter. Red Team is reading Shadow Club and exploring literature circles with Sweet Whispers Brother Rush. While Yellow Team is reading either Fe- ver 1793, Flipped, or Tom Sawyer.

All seventh grade math students finished working on finding the GCF (greatest common factor) and LCM (least common multiple) of monomials and learned about multiplying and dividing powers with the same bases. To finish off the 4th quarter, students will be adding, subtracting, multiplying, and dividing fractions. They will also be learning about polynomials... finding the degree, putting them into standard form, and also evaluating them.

Enjoy the rest of the school year. Have a safe summer!

6th Grade

In sixth grade, all language arts students have been hard at work with their research paper. Each student randomly picked a famous person to do their project about. In literature, the teachers and stu-



dents are reading novels. To better understand these novels, the students are working in literature circles. In science, students got to design their own cars. Now they are experimenting with vinegar and water. Social studies classes have traveled from Ancient Greece to Ancient Rome and will also be studying the Ancient Olmec, Mayan, Aztec, and Inca civiliza-

tions. In math, students are learning the difference between mean, median, mode, and range. They are also studying data and how to show it as graphs and statistics. In computers, we are beginning internet safety. We are teaching the students how to be safe and showing them the dangers of social networking.

Nurse's Corner

This is our last newsletter for this school year. Hopefully I can clarify issues regarding physicals and sport physicals. Here we go!!

Students entering sixth grade must have a new physical on file in the nurse's office in order to come to school. We have a first day exclusion policy which means your student cannot come to school on the first day if they do not have a completed physical. The sixth grade physical is good for the sports physical if the doctor marks "yes" to the two areas on the physical that says physical education and interscholastic sports. It is good for one year from the date on the exam. If you wish the student to participate in sports throughout the entire school year, get the physical sometime between June and August.

Students entering seventh and eighth grade - A reminder to parents about sport physicals - Sportlink will be coming to Simmons on August 26th, 2010 from 11:30AM to 1:30PM. Students who wish to play sports must have a current sport physical. (A sport physical is good for one year from the date your student was seen by the doctor.) Registration is online - you must pre-register your student. **This year Sportlink will be accepting insurance!!!!** I hope this helps save you time and money. Staff, which are associated with the Sportlink program are very professional and give a complete and thorough evaluation of your student's readiness to par-

ticipate in our sport programs. This physical is good for the entire year of sport activities.

1) Go to www.sportlinkusa.com 2) Enter SIMMS for your school code 3) Choose service and follow instructions for scheduling any payment. 4) Download the appropriate forms for your choice of service. 5) Bring the completed forms at your scheduled appointment.

The Worth Clinic also gives lower cost sport physicals. Call them at (708) 371-3398. They are located at 11601 South Pulaski Road, Alsip Il. 60803. Call early, they fill up fast. Minute clinics at Walgreens also do sport physicals. Locations are posted at our main office.

Reminder: Sixth graders also need a dental exam to be completed by the end of sixth grade.

Simmons offers Smile Illinois Mobile Dentists program every May. This year they are coming on **May 11th** ---forms were sent home about four weeks ago.

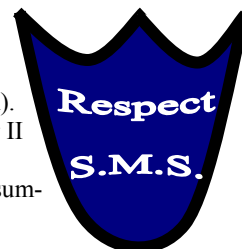

There were even more great performances at the SWIC Declamation Meet at Liberty Junior High School on April 21st. Con-

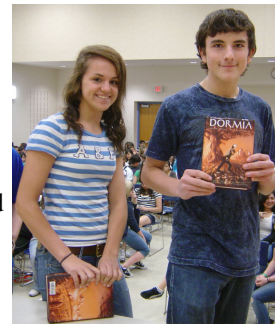
